Dear Water Board members,

I have seen and read about the order for recycled water but have been increasingly worried about its proposed use. Having lived on the Russian River I am concerned about that area, it's residents' health and especially the gorgeous river. I've been aware of information sent to you by Russian River Watershed Protection Committee and it strikes me that the State Water Board really needs to give more attention to that information about recycled water. More management of it than has been given to discover hidden toxins seems imperative and not just for the residents and fish of *that* area.

Brenda Adelman, the RRWPC chair has been researching and sending you vital statistics from valid studies on water quality, *sincerely sending them*, for years. And showing how more "stringent. mandatory requirements of water conservation (in ag as well as urban use)" is a preferable course to take... in conjunction with the very careful use of recycled water. California could be missing the boat by hurrying through a water policy such as the one proposed now. (General Order WDRs for Recycled Water Use)

I certainly respect the work of State agencies in matters so important to the health of the people they represent. Please give some more thought to RRWPC's supportive information.
