





North Edwards Water District

• Service Connections: 217








Water Quality

- Out-of-compliance with the arsenic maximum contaminant level (MCL) of 10 micrograms/liter
 - 10 drops of water in Olympic sized pool
- Long-term exposure health concerns:
 - Skin damage
 - Circulatory system complications
 - Increased cancer risk



Infrastructure Needs

- Current storage capacity is 105,000 gallons
- The highest total <u>daily</u> water usage demand of the water system is approximately 200,000 gallons



Managerial Limitations

- Lack of administrative staff
- Lack of financial capacity to implement solutions










ADMINISTRATORS



Administrator Authority

- Applicability:
 - A public water system or state small water system that serves a disadvantaged community and that the state board finds consistently fails to provide an adequate supply of affordable, safe drinking water.
- Full-Scope Administrator:
 - Person or entity who is appointed and/or authorized to exercise total and complete managerial control over a designated water system.



- Antelope Valley-East Kern (AVEK) Water Agency Connection
- Infrastructure Improvements
- Community Accountability and Engagement Plan
- Post-Administrator Drinking Water Service Plan
- Additional Considerations

Antelope Valley-East Kern Connection (AVEK)

- AVEK is a wholesale water provider
 - Serves parts of Los Angeles, Kern, and Ventura Counties
 - Treats, stores, and distributes water
 - In-compliance with water quality standards
- North Edwards is approximately 500 feet from AVEK pipeline
- Long-term sustainability



Infrastructure Improvements

- Additional storage
- Evaluation of infrastructure needs
- Rate analysis



Community Accountability and Engagement Plan

- Administrator develops within 90 days
- Public meetings at least once every three (3) months
 - Provide 10-day notice
 - Opportunity for public comment
- Community involvement
- Public access to records



Post-Administrator Drinking Water Service Plan

- Evaluate long-term solutions
- Examples could include:
 - Managerial consolidation
 - Board member recruitment
 - Full office staff








Additional Considerations


- Consolidate Fountain Trailer Park
 - Out-of-compliance with arsenic MCL
 - Population: 68
- Consolidate Sunset Apartments
 - Out-of-compliance with arsenic MCL
 - Population: 37

Goals

- Complete necessary improvements:
 - Purchased water connection
 - Storage capacity
 - Infrastructure improvements
- Maintain public engagement
- Evaluate long-term solutions








How to ask questions and comments?
