

# **Fact Sheet**

## DWSRF Lead Service Line Replacement Funding Program

#### **General Information**

- Eligible applicants include Community Water Systems and Non-Profit Public Water Systems that regularly serve at least 25 of the same persons over six months per year.
- Water systems serving disadvantaged communities are eligible for up to 100% of the costs for eligible activities with no expectation of repayment (Principal Forgiveness).
- Water systems serving non-disadvantaged communities are eligible for 0% interest loans for up to 100% of the costs for eligible activities.

### **Eligible Projects**

- Preparing an LSL inventory that meets the requirements of the US EPA's Lead and Copper Rules Revision (LCRR)
  - Historical records review
  - Physically inspecting lines\*
  - Preparing and issuing public notices
  - Formatting the completed inventory and submitting it to Division of Drinking Water
  - Previously completed LSL inventories may also be eligible for reimbursement
- disturbing activities

\*Contact

DFA prior to any ground-

- Replacing LSLs\* on both the water system-owned side and customer-owned side
- Replacing galvanized lines\* that are currently or were in the past downstream of a lead line

Notable federal requirements include Build America, Buy America (BABA) domestic preference, Davis-Bacon prevailing wage, and Disadvantaged Business Enterprise good faith effort.

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### **How to Apply**

Eligible applicants can submit the <u>Lead Service Line Replacement Program Application</u> packages (see appendix R of the DWSRF Policy) via the <u>Financial Assistance Application Submittal Tool (FAAST).</u>

- Customer Self-identification Surveying
- Inventory Procedure Training Materials
- Preparing Outreach Materials
- Template Access Agreements

- Preparing Applications for LSL Replacement Funding
