NOTICE OF VIRTUAL WEBINARS ON WATER RIGHTS AND FISHERIES IN SCOTT RIVER AND SHASTA RIVER WATERSHEDS

State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) and California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) staff will host two virtual meetings to present introductory information about water rights and fisheries in the Scott River and Shasta River watersheds. These educational presentations are meant to continue to provide information and an opportunity for engagement on important topics as the drought emergency regulation for the watersheds expires. The webinars provide an opportunity to continue to establish a common knowledge base between the community, agencies, and other interested parties as we continue to engage on efforts to manage water resources in these watersheds. Details of the public webinars are as follows:

Webinar #1: Water Rights 101

When: Thursday, August 3, 2023 at 4:00 PM Overview: State Water Board staff will provide an introduction and overview of key water right concepts related to these watersheds.

Webinar #2: Fish 101

When: Thursday, September 14, 2023 at 4:00 PM Overview: CDFW staff will present information on key species, basic habitat needs, and the status of fish populations in the watersheds.
