TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM PERMIT AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS- SANTA CATALINA ISLAND COMPANY AND HAMILTON PACIFIC, TEMPORARY TEST WELL PROJECT, MIDDLE RANCH, SANTA CATALINA ISLAND, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG994005, CI 10067)

Dear Mr. DeMyer:

In our letter dated July 11, 2014 we informed you that the subject discharge is regulated under Order No. R4-2003-0108, General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System and Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Groundwater from Potable Water Supply Wells to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties, adopted by this Board on August 7, 2003.

On March 17, 2016, you informed the Regional Board that the proposed project was never started due to access issues with the landowner. Since the NPDES permit is no longer necessary, you requested termination of coverage under the above-referenced General NPDES permit.

Since the NPDES permit is no longer needed, coverage under Board Order R4-2003-0108 for the subject site is hereby terminated, except for enforcement purposes. Please note that if future discharges of groundwater to surface water or land become necessary, you must file a Report of Waste Discharge with this Board and obtain appropriate Waste Discharge Requirements.
