TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM PERMIT AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS- CAMROSA WATER DISTRICT, PLEASANT VALLEY WELL NO. 2, 5304 LYNWOOD DRIVE, CAMARILLO, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG994005, CI 10132)

Dear Mr. Stafford:

In our letter dated February 23, 2015, we informed you that the subject discharge is regulated under Order No. R4-2003-0108, General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System and Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Groundwater from Potable Water Supply Wells to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties, adopted by this Board on August 7, 2003.

On January 7, 2016, your staff (Mr. Michael Phelps) informed the Regional Board that your agency completed construction of the well and all groundwater discharges from the above-referenced project to the Conejo Creek have ceased. Since the NPDES permit is no longer necessary, Mr. Phelps requested termination of coverage under the above-referenced General NPDES permit.

Since the NPDES permit is no longer needed, coverage under Board Order R4-2003-0108 for the subject site is hereby terminated, except for enforcement purposes. Please note that if future discharges of groundwater to surface water or land become necessary, you must file a Report of Waste Discharge with this Board and obtain appropriate Waste Discharge Requirements.
