TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS – LOS ANGELES CONVENTION CENTER, CITY OF LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG994003, CI-5900)

The subject discharge is regulated under Order No. R4-2003-0058, *General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System and Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Nonprocess Wastewater to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties*, which also serves as your NPDES permit.

You have requested this office to terminate the subject permit because you have ceased discharging nonprocess wastewater into a local storm drain at your facility. An inspection conducted by staff from this office on December 2, 2005, confirmed that the nonprocess wastewater discharge has been routed to the local sewer system.

Since discharge of nonprocess wastewater to surface waters has ceased, the NPDES permit is not necessary and coverage under Board Order No. R4-2003-0058 for the subject site is hereby terminated except for enforcement purposes.

Please note that if future discharges of groundwater to surface waters become necessary, you must file a Report of Waste Discharge with this office and obtain Waste Discharge Requirements prior to discharging any groundwater from the site to surface waters.
