GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR REPORTING

1. Monitoring reports shall be submitted to the Regional Board by the 15th day of the following reporting period. In reporting the monitoring data, the discharger shall arrange the data in tabular form. If no wastes were deposited during the reporting period, the report shall so state.
2. If Board requirements are not met, a statement shall be submitted of the actions undertaken or proposed which will bring the operation into full compliance with requirements at the earliest time and submit a timetable for cleanup and/or correction.
3. By January 30 of each year, beginning in 1976, the operator shall submit an annual report to the Regional Board. The report shall contain both tabular and graphical summaries of the data reported during the previous year. In addition, the operator shall discuss the compliance record and the corrective actions taken or planned which may be needed to bring the operation into full compliance with the waste discharge requirements.
4. Each report shall contain the following completed declaration:

"I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.

REPORTING

1. The annual report to the Board shall include a map of the site and shall indicate the areas that are currently being filled and the areas where fill has been completed.
2. A report containing the following information shall be filed with this Board for each calendar quarter:
 - a. A tabular list of the estimated average monthly quantities (in tons) and types of Class III material deposited each month.
 - b. An estimate of the remaining life of the site in years and months.
 - c. A certification that all wastes deposited were in compliance with the Board's requirements and that no wastes have been deposited outside of the boundaries of the site as specified in the Board's requirements.
 - d. The average percent of organics in the material deposited during the quarter.

3. The reports shall be submitted quarterly.
4. These records and reports are public documents and shall be made available for inspection during business hours at the offices of the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Los Angeles Region.

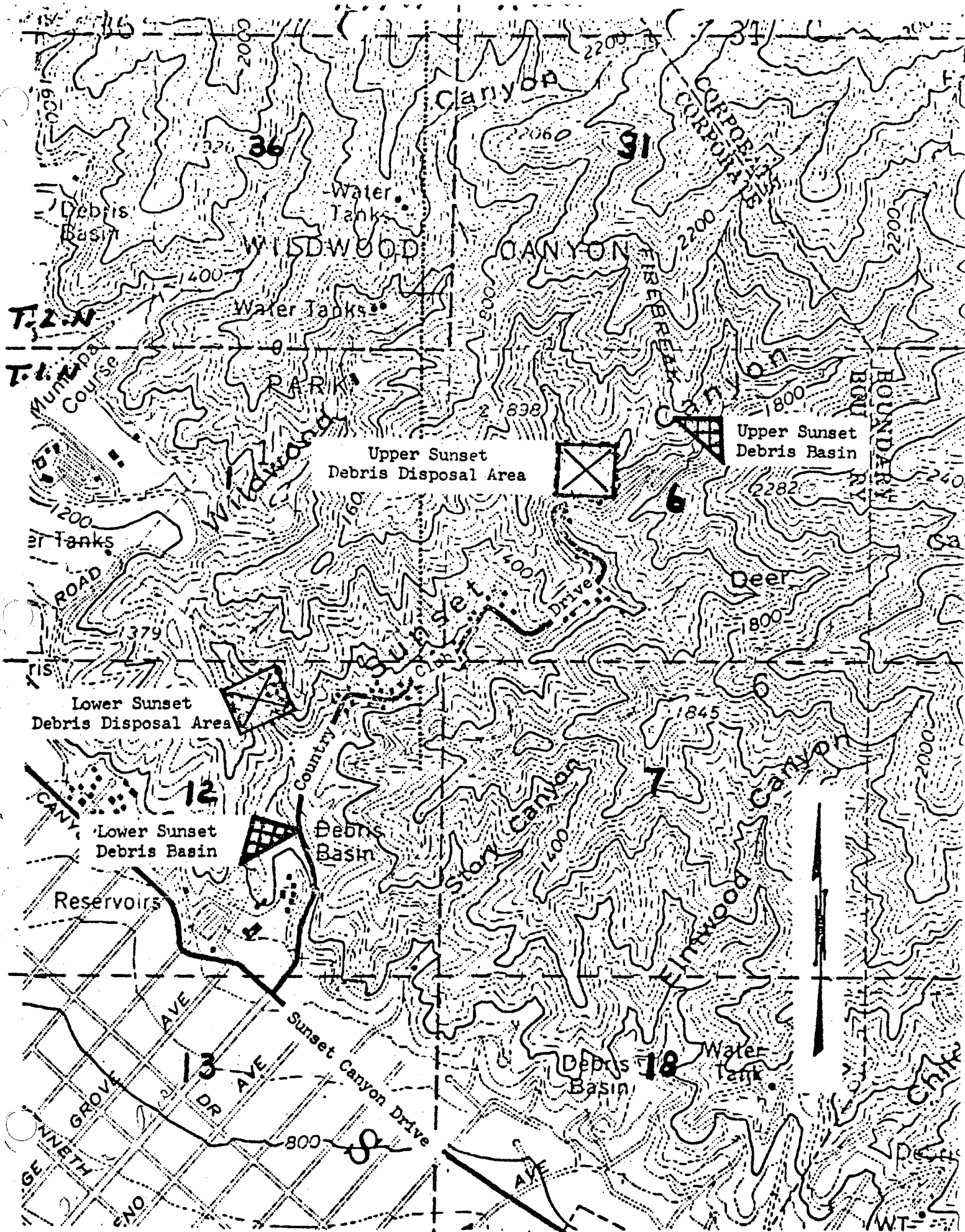

WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS
FOR

LOS ANGELES COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT
(Sunset Canyon-Upper Debris Disposal Area
Burbank Eastern System - Lower Sunset Disposal Area)
(File 75-2)

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Los Angeles Region, finds:

1. Los Angeles County Flood Control District filed reports of waste discharge for the disposal of solid wastes.
2. Los Angeles County Flood Control District proposes to discharge materials removed from debris basins, consisting of natural erosion products such as earth, rock, sand, and vegetation at two sites in Sunset Canyon of the Verdugo Mountains, in the City of Burbank. One site, known as the Upper Sunset Disposal Basin, occupies 7.6 acres in Section 6, T1N, R13W, S.B.B.&M. The second site, known as the Lower Sunset Disposal Basin, occupies 4.6 acres and is located in Section 12, T1N, R14W, S.B.B.&M. Both sites are shown on the map in Attachment A.
3. The disposal sites are on land owned by the City of Burbank but will be operated by Los Angeles County Flood Control District.
4. The disposal sites are within the Verdugo Hydrologic Subarea and are underlain by essentially non-water bearing Basement Complex.
5. There are no producing water wells in the immediate vicinity of either disposal site. The nearest well is 1.5 miles south of the lower disposal area, and the major groundwater extraction area (City of Burbank Well Field) is centered about four miles to the southwest.
6. The Board adopted a Water Quality Control Plan for the Los Angeles River Basin on March 10, 1975. The Plan contains water quality objectives for the Los Angeles River Basin, including the Verdugo Basin.
7. Groundwaters in the Verdugo Basin are beneficially used for municipal, agricultural, and industrial supply.



The Board has notified the discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to prescribe waste discharge requirements for this discharge.

The Board in a public meeting heard and considered all comments pertaining to the discharge.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that Los Angeles County Flood Control District shall comply with the following:

A. Discharge Specifications

1. Disposal at these sites shall only be by Los Angeles County Flood Control District or by persons acting on behalf of the Los Angeles County Flood Control District. There shall be no public use of these sites for the disposal of wastes. The disposal of any wastes other than those generated in the cleaning of Upper Sunset and Lower Sunset Debris Basins and others in the close vicinity is prohibited.
2. Wastes disposed of at these sites shall be limited to material removed from debris basins that has been deposited in those basins by natural causes.
3. No decomposable refuse such as ordinary household and commercial refuse, metal, paper and paper products, cloth, wood, lawn cuttings, shrubbery, hair, hide, bones, dead animals, market refuse, garbage, etc., shall be deposited at these sites.
4. No liquids, oils, waxes, tars, soaps, solvents, or readily water-soluble solids such as salt, borax, lye, or caustic shall be deposited at these sites.
5. No materials which are of a toxic nature, such as insecticides, poisons, or radioactive materials, shall be deposited at these sites.
6. Wastes deposited at these sites shall be confined thereto, and shall not be permitted to enter drainage ditches or watercourses.
7. Erosion of deposited materials by surface runoff shall be prevented.
8. Neither the discharge nor any handling of wastes shall cause pollution or nuisance.
9. The discharger shall remove any wastes which are discharged at this site in violation of these requirements.

B. Provisions

1. The discharger shall maintain a copy of this order at the site so as to be available at all times to site operating personnel.
2. The discharger shall file with this Board a report of any material change or proposed change in the character, location, boundaries or quantity of this waste discharge.
3. In the event of any change in name of operator or in control or ownership of land or waste disposal facilities owned or controlled by the discharger, the discharger shall:
 - a. Notify this Board of such change; and
 - b. Notify the succeeding owner or operator by letter, a copy of which shall be filed with this Board, of the existence of this order.
4. Ninety (90) days prior to cessation of disposal operations at this site, the discharger shall submit a technical report to the Board describing the methods and controls to be used to assure protection of the quality of receiving waters during final operations and with any proposed subsequent use of the land. Such methods and controls shall comply with the foregoing waste discharge requirements. The report shall be prepared by or under the supervision of a registered engineer or a registered engineering geologist.
5. In accordance with the California Water Code, the discharger shall furnish, under penalty of perjury, technical monitoring program reports; such reports shall be submitted in accordance with specifications prepared by the Executive Officer, which specifications are subject to periodic revisions as may be warranted.
6. This Board considers the property owner to have a continuing responsibility for correcting any problems which may arise in the future as a result of this waste discharge or water applied to this property during subsequent use of the land for other purposes
