WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS – BP WEST COAST PRODUCTS LLC, BP WILMINGTON CALCINER, WILMINGTON, CA, NPDES NO. CA0059153, CI NO. 6571

Our letter dated April 18, 2007, transmitted a tentative order for renewal of your permit to discharge wastes under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES).

Pursuant to Division 7 of the California Water Code, this Regional Board at a public hearing held on June 7, 2007, reviewed the tentative requirements, considered all factors in the case, and adopted Order No. R4-2007-0031 (copy attached) relative to this waste discharge. Order No. R4-2007-0031 serves as your permit under the NPDES and expires on May 10, 2012. Section 13376 of the California Water Code requires that an application for a new permit must be filed at least 180 days before the expiration date.

You are required to implement the *Monitoring and Reporting Program* (MRP) on the effective date of Order No. R4-2007-0031. Your first monitoring report for the third quarter reporting period is due by November 1, 2007. All monitoring reports should be sent to the Regional Board, Attn: Information Technology Unit.

When submitting monitoring, technical reports, or any correspondence regarding the discharge under Order No. R4-2007-0031 to the Regional Board, please include a reference to *Compliance File No. CI 6571 and NPDES No. CA0059153*, which will assure that the reports are directed to the appropriate file and staff. Please do not combine your discharge monitoring reports with other reports. Please submit each type of report as a separate document.



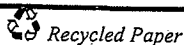
