WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS AND NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMIT AND TIME SCHEDULE ORDER (TSO), LOS ANGELES COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS, MALIBU MESA WASTEWATER RECLAMATION FACILITY (NPDES NO. CA0059099, CI NO. 6599)

Our letter dated December 20, 2006, transmitted revised tentative Waste Discharge Requirements and Time Schedule Order (TSO) for your discharge of wastes from the Malibu Mesa Wastewater Reclamation Facility (WRF) into Marie Canyon and an unnamed canyon west of Marie Canyon, thence to Puerco Beach/Santa Monica Bay.

Pursuant to Division 7 of the California Water Code, this Regional Board at a public hearing held on January 11, 2007, reviewed the revised tentative requirements, TSO, and January 8, 2007, Change Sheet, considered all comments received, and adopted Order No. R4-2007-002 relative to the Malibu Mesa WRF's waste discharge. Order No. R4-2007-002 expires on December 10, 2011. The Regional Board also adopted the accompanying Time Schedule Order No. R4-2007-0003 for the Malibu Mesa WRF. Section 13376 of the California Water Code requires that a complete application for a new permit must be filed at least 180 days before the expiration date.

When submitting monitoring or technical reports to the Regional Board, as required by your "Monitoring and Reporting Program", please send them <u>ATTN: Information Technology Unit</u> and include a reference to "Compliance File No. 6599" for the Malibu Mesa WRF. This will assure that the reports are directed to the appropriate file and staff. Also, please do not combine other reports with your monitoring reports. Submit each type of report as a separate document.

We are sending the final copy of Order No. R4-2007-0002 and Order No. R4-2007-0003 only to the Los Angeles County Department of Public Works. For those on the mailing list, an electronic copy will be sent through e-mail.
