CONTINUATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS – GLENDALE DOCKER PARTNERSHIP, CENTRAL STOCKER LTD., 1140-1160 NORTH CENTRAL AVENUE, GLENDALE, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG994003, CI–6762)

We have completed our evaluation of your waste discharge under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit. On April 1, 2003, the Regional Board adopted Order No. R4-2004-0058, General NPDES Permit No. CAG994003 that replaced Order No. 98-055, CAG994003. On April 8, 2004, a Notice to Comply was sent to you, requiring you to submit analytical data of groundwater samples from your site, and to complete the Notice of Intent (NOI) Form that was attached. Because we did not received the analytical data from you to conduct a reasonable potential analysis, we have incorporated effluent limitations for toxic priority pollutants based on the data that we have in our file. Upon receipt of your updated analytical water quality data and a complete NOI, the number of constituents that have effluent limitation that are required to be monitored may be revised to eliminate those pollutants that have no reasonable potential.

Based on the attached Fact Sheet and other information available to the office, we have determined that the groundwater discharge meets the conditions to be regulated under Order No. R4-2004-0058, General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System and Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Nonprocess Wastewater to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties, adopted by this Board on April 1, 2004.

Enclosed are your Waste Discharge Requirements, which also serve as your NPDES permit, consisting of Order No. R4-2004-0058 and Monitoring and Reporting Program No. CI-6762. The discharge limitations in Part E.1.a. and Part E. 1.b. of Order No. R4-2004-0058 for the specific constituents listed on the Table with the enclosed Fact Sheet are applicable to your discharge. The discharge flows into the Los Angeles River. Therefore, the discharge limitations in Attachment B.7.b of Order No. R4-2004-0058 are applicable to your discharge.

The Monitoring and Reporting Program requires you to implement the monitoring program on the effective date of coverage under this permit. All monitoring reports should be sent to the Regional Board, <u>ATTN: Information Technology Unit</u>. When submitting monitoring or technical reports to the Regional Board per these requirements, please include a reference to "Compliance File No. CI-6762 and NPDES No. CAG994003", which will assure that the reports are directed to the

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appropriate file and staff. Also, please do not combine other reports with your monitoring reports. Submit each type of report as a separate document.

In order to avoid future annual fees, please submit written notification when the project has been completed and the permit is no longer needed.

We are sending a copy of Order No. R4-2004-0058 only to the applicant. For those on the mailing list, please refer to the Board Order previously sent to you.
