REVISED COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM PERMIT AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS – MACERICH VILLA MARINA MARKET PLACE, 13455 MAXELLA AVENUE, MARINA DEL REY (NPDES CAG994002, CI-6834)

Discharge of treated groundwater from the Marina Market Place is currently regulated under NPDES General Permit No. CAG994001 (Order No. 97-045) adopted by this Board on May 12, 1997. By a letter dated February 27, 2001, Sigma Engineering Inc. staff, Cheryl Haines, requested that the monitoring frequency contained in Monitoring and Reporting Program No. Cl-6834 be revised for oil and grease, BOD, turbidity, sulfides, total suspended solids, and pH from quarterly and semiannually to annually. The reduction in monitoring frequency is requested because the monitoring data indicates that you have been meeting the effluent limits for these compounds for the past four years.

Regional Board staff have reviewed your NPDES permit and the discharge monitoring reports and determined that NPDES Permit No. CAG994001, Order No. 97-045 is inappropriate for your discharge. We have determined that your discharge is more appropriately regulated under NPDES Permit No. CAG994002, Order No. 97-043, General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit and Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Treated Groundwater from Construction and Project Dewatering to Surface Waters, adopted by this Board on May 12, 1997.

Enclosed are your new Waste Discharge Requirements which also serves as your General NPDES permit, consisting of Order No. 97-043 and revised Monitoring and Reporting Program No. CI-6834. The discharge limitations in Part E of Order No. 97-043 are applicable to your discharge. Attachment A is not applicable to your discharge. Please note that we have revised the monitoring frequency for oil and grease, BOD, turbidity, sulfides, total suspended solids, and pH from quarterly and semiannually to annually. Your annual fee will increase from \$400 to \$750 for the coverage under Order No. 97-043. The coverage for Macerich Management Company under CAG994001, Order No. 97-045 will be terminated in a separate letter.
