PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

Cochran Island Apartments, LLC (Cochran) owns and operates the Cochran Apartments building located at 342 South Cochran Avenue, Los Angeles (See Figure 1 for site location). Cochran currently discharges groundwater seepage from the building's footing drainage under general NPDES permit No. CAG994001 (Order No. 97-045) issued on June 30, 1997. The dewatering is necessary to protect the integrity of the building structure from rising groundwater. Cochran has submitted a Notice of Intent dated September 15, 2003 to apply for continuing enrollment under the general NPDES permit. Treatment may be necessary to reduce pollutant concentrations in the discharge to comply with effluent limitations.

VOLUME AND DESCRIPTION OF DISCHARGE:

Up to 150,000 gallons per day of groundwater is being discharged from the office building to Outfall No. 1 (Latitude: 34° 05' 05", Longitude: 118° 20' 47") which flows into Ballona Creek, a water of the United States.

APPLICABLE EFFLUENT LIMITATIONS

Based on the information provided in the NPDES Application Supplemental Requirements and self-monitoring reports, the following constituents listed in the Table below have been determined to show reasonable potential to exist in the discharge. The groundwater discharge flows into Ballona Creek which is designated as MUN (Potential) beneficial use. Therefore, discharge limitations under "Other Waters" column apply to the discharge. The discharge limitation for a hardness dependent metal (copper) is selected according to Section E.1.b. of the Order.

FREQUENCY OF DISCHARGE:

The groundwater discharge is continuous and will last throughout the life of the building.

REUSE OF WATER:

Offsite disposal of the groundwater discharge is not feasible due to high cost of disposal. The property and the immediate vicinity have no landscaped areas that require irrigation using the groundwater discharge. Since there are no feasible reuse options, the groundwater will be discharged to the storm drain.
