TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMIT – 143 S. HAYWORTH AVENUE, LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG994001, CI-7077)

In our letter dated December 3, 1991, we determined that the subject discharge is regulated under Order No. 91-092 which also serves as your NPDES permit. In our May 21,1997, correspondence we transmitted to you Order No. 97-045 that replaced Order No. 91-092.

Your letter dated November 15, 2000, informed the Board that there is no groundwater dewatering activities or discharge occurring at the site, therefore, the NPDES permit is no longer needed. However, you have indicated that the sump at your facility collects only rainwater from the roof. During rainy season the sump pump automatically activates to discharge the collected rainwater to the storm drain. An NPDES permit is not necessary for the roof drainage discharge; these discharges are currently regulated under the municipal storm water permit for Los Angeles County. On March 14, 2001, our staff inspected the building at 143 S. Hayworth Avenue, Los Angeles and determined that there is no groundwater discharge occurring at the site.

Since there is no groundwater discharge to waters of the State, coverage under Board Order No. 97-045 for the subject facility is hereby terminated.
