TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMIT—LAXFUEL CORPORATION—LAXFUEL REMEDIATION PROJECT, 9900 LAXFUEL ROAD, LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG914001, CI-7568)

In our letter dated August 23, 2007, we informed you that the subject discharge is regulated under Order No. R4-2007-0022, *Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges Treated Groundwater From Investigation and/or Cleanup of Volatile Organic Compounds Contaminated-Sites to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties*, adopted by this Board on April 5, 2007, which also serves as your NPDES permit.

We have received and reviewed your March 2, 2010, letter requesting termination of your coverage under the General Permit. The letter indicated that you have completed the aforementioned remediation project, and that on February 26, 2010, you ceased discharging groundwater from the site.

On March 10, 2010, Board staff inspected the project site and verified that there is no discharge of groundwater from the site to the storm drain. Since there is no discharge of groundwater from the site, coverage under Board Order No. R4-2007-0022, General NPDES Permit No. CAG914001, for the subject project is hereby terminated except for enforcement purposes.

Please note that if future discharge of any groundwater to surface water become necessary at the site, you must file a Report of Waste Discharge with this Board and obtain appropriate waste discharge requirements.
