REVISED COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMIT CAG994003 AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENT ORDER NO. 98-055 – COAST PACKING COMPANY, 3257 EAST VERNON AVENUE, VERNON, CALIFORNIA

We have completed a review of our records for your discharge at the above-referenced facility. During our review, it came to our attention that your are still operating under General NPDES permit and Waste Discharge Requirements contained in Order No. 94-058 adopted by this Regional Board on May 9, 1994. As you may be aware, this Regional Board, at a public hearing held on June 29, 1998, adopted Order No. 98-055, General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit and Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Nonprocess Wastewaters Not Requiring Treatment Systems to Surface Waters in the Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties, and rescinded Order No. 94-058.

Therefore, enclosed are your new Waste Discharge Requirements, which also serves as your NPDES permit, consisting of Order No. 98-055 and revised Monitoring and Reporting Program No. CI-7652.

The discharge limitations in Part E of Order No. 98-055 are applicable to your discharge. In addition, the discharge limitations in Attachment A and Attachment B.7.d are applicable to your discharge. The Monitoring and Reporting Program requires you to implement the monitoring program on the effective date of coverage under Order No. 98-055. All monitoring reports should be sent to the Regional Board, <u>ATTN: Information Technology Unit</u>.

When submitting monitoring and technical reports to the Regional Board per these requirements, please include a reference to "Compliance File No. CI-7652 and NPDES No. CAG994003", which will assure that the reports are directed to the appropriate file and staff. Also, please do not combine your discharge monitoring reports with other reports. Submit each type of report as a separate document.

In order to avoid future annual fees, please submit written notification when the project has been completed and the permit is no longer needed.
