**CONTINUATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS – WORLD OIL MARKETING COMPANY, STATION NO. 43, 12215 E. SOUTH STREET, ARTESIA, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG834001, CI-7667)**

We have completed our review of your Notice of Intent (NOI) and analytical results of representative groundwater samples submitted in order to continue enrollment under the General NPDES Permit. Discharge of groundwater generated from the above-referenced facility is currently regulated under NPDES General Permit No. CAG834001 (Order No. 97-046), adopted by this Board on May 12, 1997.

Based on the attached Fact Sheet and other information provided, we have determined that the proposed discharge of treated groundwater from groundwater cleanup activities meets the conditions to be regulated under Order No. R4-2002-0125, *General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System and Waste Discharge Requirements for Treated Groundwater and Other Wastewaters from Investigation and/or Cleanup of Petroleum Fuel-Contaminated Sites to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties*, adopted by this Board on July 11, 2002. Your existing enrollment under NPDES Permit No. CAG834001, Order No. 97-046, which was issued to you on August 12, 1997, is superseded by this new permit that terminated your coverage under Order No. 97-046.

Enclosed are your Waste Discharge Requirements, which also serve as your NPDES permit, consisting of Order No. R4-2002-0125 and Monitoring and Reporting Program No. CI-7667. Prior to starting discharge, a representative sample of the effluent is required to be obtained and analyzed to determine compliance with the discharge limitations. The groundwater discharge flows into the Coyote Creek, thence into San Gabriel River. Therefore, the discharge limitations in Attachment B of Order No. R4-2002-0125 are not applicable to your discharge.

The Monitoring and Reporting Program requires you to implement the monitoring program on the effective date of coverage under this permit. All monitoring reports should be sent to the Regional Board, ATTN: Information Technology Unit.

When submitting monitoring or technical reports to the Regional Board per these requirements, please include a reference to "Compliance File No. CI-7667 and NPDES No. CAG834001", which

will assure that the reports are directed to the appropriate file and staff. Also, please do not combine other reports with your monitoring reports. Submit each type of report as a separate document.

In order to avoid future annual fees, please submit written notification when the project has been completed and the permit is no longer needed.
