WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS – LINCOLN AVENUE WATER COMPANY, SOUTH COULTER SURFACE WATER TREATMENT PLANT, ALTADENA, CA. (NPDES NO. CA0064068, CI NO. 7752)

Our letters dated December 17, 2008, and August 5, 2009, transmitted a tentative order and a revised tentative order for issuance of a permit for the subject facility to discharge wastes under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Program.

Pursuant to Division 7 of the California Water Code, this Regional Board at a public hearing held on October 1, 2009, reviewed the revised tentative Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs), considered all factors in the case, and adopted Order No. R4-2009-0103 (copy attached) relative to this waste discharge. Order No. R4-2009-0103 serves as your permit under the NPDES program and expires on September 10, 2014. Section 13376 of the California Water Code requires that an application for a new permit must be filed at least 180 days before the expiration date.

You are required to implement the *Monitoring and Reporting Program (MRP)* on the effective date of Order No. R4-2009-0103. Your first monitoring report for the November, 2009, reporting period is due by February 1, 2010. All monitoring reports should be sent to the Regional Board, Attn: Information Technology Unit.

When submitting monitoring, technical reports, or any correspondence regarding the discharge under Order No. R4-2009-0103 to the Regional Board, please include a reference to *Compliance File No. CI 7752 and NPDES No. CA0064068*, which will assure that the reports are directed to the appropriate file and staff. Please do not combine your discharge monitoring reports with other reports. Please submit each type of report as a separate document.


