TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMIT – CALIFORNIA WATER SERVICE COMPANY, WELL NUMBERS 219-02, 275-01, 277-01, 277-01, CARSON, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG994001, CI-7846)

In our letter dated August 22, 2001, we determined that the subject discharge is regulated under Order No. 97-045, *General NPDES and Waste Discharge Requirements for Groundwater Discharges from Construction and Project Dewatering to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties*, which also serves as your NPDES permit.

California Water Service Company (District) operates potable wells located within the District's service area. In order to manage the NPDES permit compliance more effectively, permits for wells that discharge into the same waterbody with identical water quality objectives can be combined into one permit. Consequently, the District has applied for new permits to cover potable wells grouped according to receiving waterbodies and/or stream reaches. The Regional Board completed issuing these new permits in March 2004. Since a new permit has been issued for the above-mentioned wells, coverage under CI-7846 is no longer needed. Therefore, coverage under Board Order No. 97-045 for the subject site is hereby terminated except for enforcement purposes.
