TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMIT – HALL WELL SITE, 5648 NORTH HALIFAX ROAD, TEMPLE CITY (NPDES CAG994001, CI-7957)

In our letter dated October 6, 1998, we informed you that the subject discharge is regulated under Order No. 97-045, *General NPDES and Waste Discharge Requirements for Groundwater Discharges from Construction and Project Dewatering to Surface Waters*, which also serves as your NPDES permit.

On November 15, 2002, you informed the Regional Board staff that the project was completed on October 1998. On February 27, 2003, Board staff inspected the facility, and verified that there is no discharge to the storm drain.

Since there is no discharge from the project to the storm drain, coverage under Board Order No. 97-045 for the subject facility is hereby terminated except for enforcement purposes. If you have any questions, please contact Vilma Correa at (213) 576-6794.
