## CONTINUATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM PERMIT AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS – EQUILON ENTERPRISES LLC, D.B.A. SHELL OIL PRODUCTS US, SHELL STATION LOCATED 11151 LONG BEACH BOULEVARD, LYNWOOD, CALIFORNIA, (NPDES NO. CAG834001, CI-8169)

We have completed our review of your Notice of Intent for the above-referenced facility for a continuation to discharge waste under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES). Based on the information provided, the discharge from your facility meets the conditions specified in Order No. R4-2002-0125, *Waste Discharge Requirements for Treated Groundwater and Other Wastewaters from Investigation and/or Cleanup of Petroleum Fuel-Contaminated Sites to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties (General NPDES Permit No. CAG834001)*, adopted by this Board on July 11, 2002.

Enclosed are your Waste Discharge Requirements, which also serve as your General NPDES permit, consisting of Order No. R4-2002-0125 and Monitoring and Reporting Program (MRP) No. CI-8169. Order No. R4-2002-0125 replaced Order No. 97-046, which has been terminated. Discharge from the facility drains to the Los Angeles River; therefore, the discharge limitations in Attachment B.7.d are applicable to your discharge. Compliance with the new permit Order No. R4-2002-0125 and MRP CI-8169 is effective upon receipt of this authorization letter.

All monitoring reports should be sent to the Regional Board, <u>ATTN: Information Technology</u> <u>Unit</u>. When submitting monitoring and technical reports to the Regional Board per these requirements, please include a reference to "Compliance File No. CI-8169 and NPDES No. CAG834001", which will assure that the reports are directed to the appropriate file and staff. Also, please do not combine your discharge monitoring reports with other reports. Submit each type of report as a separate document. In order to avoid future annual fees, please submit written notification when the project has been completed and the permit is no longer needed.

We are sending Board Order No. R4-2002-0125 only to the applicant. For those on the mailing list, please refer to the Board Order previously sent to you. A copy of the Order will be furnished to anyone who requests it.
