COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM PERMIT AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS – SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA WATER COMPANY, SAN GABRIEL WATER TREATMENT PLANT, 2630 S. SAN GABRIEL BLVD., ROSEMEAD, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG994003, CI-8252)

We have completed our review of your application for a permit to discharge waste under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES). You propose to use drinking well water to flush fresh granular activated carbon in carbon vessels and to store the flush water in settling tank prior to discharge.

Based on the information provided, the proposed discharge of groundwater meets the conditions specified in Order No. 98-055, General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit and Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Nonprocess Wastewaters not Requiring Treatment Systems to Surface Waters in the Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties, adopted by this Board on June 29, 1998.

Enclosed are your Waste Discharge Requirements, which also serve as your General NPDES permit, consisting of Order No. 98-055 and Monitoring and Reporting Program No. CI-8252. The discharge limitations in Part E of Order No. 98-055 are applicable to your discharge. In addition, the discharge limitations in Attachment A and B.7.g. are applicable to your discharge. Prior to discharge, a representative sample of the effluent shall be obtained and analyzed to determine compliance with the discharge limitations.

The Monitoring and Reporting Program requires you to implement the monitoring program on the effective date of coverage under this permit. All monitoring reports should be sent to the Regional Board, <u>ATTN: Information Technology Unit.</u> When submitting monitoring or technical reports to the Regional Board per these requirements, please include a reference to "Compliance File No. CI-8252 and NPDES No. CAG994003", which will assure that the reports are directed to the appropriate file and staff. Also, please do not combine other reports with your monitoring reports. Submit each type of report as a separate document.

In order to avoid future annual fees, please submit written notification when the project has been completed and the permit is no longer needed.
