PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Los Feliz Fuel Stop is an active gasoline service station. Shallow groundwater beneath the site is contaminated with petroleum hydrocarbons. The site is currently under the oversight of this Regional Board for remediation of impacted groundwater. The project consultant, PW Environmental, will be conducting aquifer pumping tests and a groundwater extraction/treatment pilot study from groundwater monitoring wells MW-1 through MW-9. The extracted groundwater will be pumped into an above ground holding tank, treated by passage through a series of three canisters containing granular activated carbon (GAC) prior to discharge.

VOLUME AND DESCRIPTION OF DISCHARGE

Up to 3,000 gallons per day of groundwater will be extracted from the groundwater monitoring wells, treated, and discharged to a storm drain located at approximately 300 yards south of the site (Latitude 34° 11' 39" Longitude 119° 09' 25"), then to the Los Angeles River, a water of the United States.

FREQUENCY OF DISCHARGE

Remedial activity is scheduled to begin in April 2001.

REUSE OF WATER

Based on the nature of the project, reuse is not feasible; therefore, the wastewater will be discharged to the storm drain.
