PROJECT DESCRIPTION

TOSCO Marketing Company (TSCO) proposes to extract and treat petroleum contaminated groundwater and then discharge the treated groundwater to the storm drain at the site. The treatment system will include a particulate filter and three activated carbon vessels.

VOLUME AND DESCRIPTION OF DISCHARGE

TOSCO will discharge up to 15,000 gallons per day of treated groundwater. The wastewater from the treatment system will be discharged through a storm drain located at Outfall No. 1 (Latitude 34° 08' 42", Longitude 118° 24' 43") and will flow to Los Angeles River, a water of the United States. See Figures 1 and 2 for the site location and the schematic of treatment diagram, respectively.

FREQUENCY OF DISCHARGE

The discharge will be intermittent and is proposed to begin on July 30, 2001.

REUSE OF WATER

TOSCO has considered other alternative reuse and/or method of disposal. Based on the surrounding land use and the nature of the project, reuse of the groundwater for construction or other uses is not feasible. Therefore, the wastewater will be discharged to the storm drain. TOSCO has also applied for a sanitary sewer permit from the Los Angeles County Department of Public Works. The approval of the sewer permit is pending upon the Regional Board action on the NPDES permit.
