TERMINATION OF GENERAL WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS AT INSTALLATION RESTORATION SITE 14 AT FORMER NAVAL STATION LONG BEACH, LONG BEACH, CALIFORNIA (ORDER NO. R4-2002-0030, SERIES NO. 002 CI-8417)

Dear Mr. Hill:

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Los Angeles Region (Regional Board) issued Order No. R4-2002-0030, (Series No. 002), which specifies Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR) for the above-referenced site (Site). We received your letter dated August 20, 2010, which notifies the Regional Board that the Navy requests termination of the WDR for the Site. In addition, the Navy is using an exemption under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) that no state permit shall be required for the remediation conducted onsite. The Navy will continue to perform remediation in accordance with the substantive requirements of applicable or relevant and appropriate requirements of the state of California.

Therefore, in consideration of your request, under Regional Board Order No. R4-2002-0030 (Series No. 002) for the Site is hereby terminated with the exception of enforcement under the term of the permit.
