TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS—CONOCOPHILLIPS COMPANY, FORMER 76 STATION 5228, 672 LAS POSAS ROAD, CAMARILLO, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG914001, CI-8442)

In our letter dated July 29, 2002, we informed you that the subject discharge is regulated under Order No. R4-2002-0107, *General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System and Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Treated Groundwater from Investigation and/or Cleanup of Volatile Organic Compounds Contaminated-sites to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties*, which also serves as your NPDES permit.

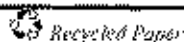
In an email dated July 12, 2007, ConocoPhillips requested Regional Board to terminate its coverage under the General NPDES permit because the groundwater treatment system at the above-referenced site has been removed. On August 15, 2007, Regional Board staff inspected the facility and verified that there is no discharge to surface waters from the project.

Since there is no discharge from the site, coverage under Board Order R4-2002-0107 for the subject facility is hereby terminated except for enforcement purposes. Please note that if future discharges of groundwater to surface waters become necessary, you must file a Report of Waste Discharge with this office and obtain Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) prior to discharging any groundwater from the site to surface waters.
