REVISED GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM PERMIT AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS—CITY OF LOS ANGELES DEPARTMENT OF WATER AND POWER—HAYNES GENERATING STATION REPOWERING PROJECT, 6801 EAST 2nd STREET, LONG BEACH, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG674001, CI-8529)

In our letter dated November 24, 2009, we authorized to discharge of hydrostatic test water from the aforementioned facility under the General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit No. CAG674001, Order No. R4-2009-0068, *Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Low Thread Hydrostatic Test Water to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties*, adopted by this Board on June 4, 2009.

We have received and reviewed your February 23, 2010, letter requesting to correct typographical error of the subtitle for the subject facility in the Fact Sheet. The subtitle to the Fact Sheet has been revised as requested.

Enclosed are your Waste Discharge Requirements, which also serve as your General NPDES Permit, consisting of Order No. R4-2009-0068 and Monitoring and Reporting Program No. CI-8529. The discharge limitations in Part V. A. of Order No. R4-2009-0068 for the specific constituents listed on the Table with the enclosed Fact Sheet are applicable to your discharge. Discharge from the project site drains to San Gabriel River Estuary (downstream from Willow Street), and the Orange County Flood Channel which flow to the Pacific Ocean. Therefore, the discharge limitations in Attachment B are not applicable to your discharge.

The Monitoring and Reporting Program requires you to implement the monitoring program on the effective date of coverage under Order No. R4-2009-0068. All monitoring reports should be sent to the Regional Board, ATTN: Information Technology Unit. When submitting monitoring or technical reports to the Regional Board per these requirements, please include a reference to "Compliance File No. CI-8529 and NPDES No. CAG6744001", which will assure that the reports are directed to the appropriate file and staff. Also, please do not combine your discharge monitoring reports with other reports. Submit each type of report as a separate document.
