**TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMIT—INDUSTRY URBAN DEVELOPMENT AGENCY, CHERYL LANE ROAD EXTENSION PROJECT, CHERYL LANE AND GRAND CROSSING PARKWAY, CITY OF INDUSTRY, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG994004, CI-8552)**

In our letter dated March 16, 2005, we informed you that the subject discharge is regulated under Order No. R4-2003-0111, *General NPDES and Waste Discharge Requirements for Groundwater Discharges from Construction and Project Dewatering to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties*, which also serves as your NPDES permit.

On December 21, 2007, you informed Regional Board staff that the above-referenced project discharge was diverted into the City of Industry's reclaimed water system on September 14, 2007. Since the NPDES permit is no longer necessary, you requested termination of your coverage under the above-referenced General NPDES permit. On January 15, 2008, Board staff inspected the facility and verified that there is no discharge to the storm drain.

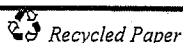
Since there is no discharge from the site to the storm drain, coverage under Board Order No. R4-2003-0111 for the subject facility is hereby terminated except for enforcement purposes. If you have any questions, please contact Vilma Correa at (213) 576-6794. Please note that if future discharges of groundwater to surface water becomes necessary, you must file a Report of Waste Discharge with this office and obtain a Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) prior to discharging any groundwater from the site to surface waters.

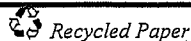
