GENERAL WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR WASTE DISCHARGES TO LAND BY SMALL DOMESTIC WASTEWATER SYSTEMS – PARADISE COVE BEACH CAFÉ, 28128 PACIFIC COAST HIGHWAY, MALIBU, CALIFORNIA, (FILE NO. 02- 076)

We have completed our review of your application for Waste Discharge Requirements for wastewater generated from the Paradise Cove Beach Café to an onsite wastewater treatment and disposal system.

Regional Board staff have reviewed the information provided and have determined that the proposed discharges meet the conditions specified in the general waste discharge requirements of the State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) Water Quality Order No. 97-10-DWQ, "General Waste Discharges to Land by Small Domestic Wastewater Treatment Systems", adopted by this State Board on November 18, 1997. Refer to the attached Fact Sheet.

Enclosed are your Waste Discharge Requirements, consisting of Order No. 97-10-DWQ, Monitoring and Reporting Program No. 97-10-DWQ (Attachment A), and Standard Provisions-Applicable to Waste Discharge Requirements (Attachment B), Monitoring and Reporting Program No. CI-8568 and Fact Sheet. Your discharge must not exceed the water quality objectives set in the Regional Board's Water Quality Control Plan including the objectives of the Ocean Plan. Please note that the median total coliform density in the groundwater at the site shall not exceed 70 per 100 milliliters (ml) and the geometric mean enterococcus density shall not exceed 24 organisms per 100 ml for a 30-day period. In addition the wastewater discharged shall not cause the receiving groundwater to exceed 2400 micrograms per liter of ammonia-nitrogen as the daily maximum.

The Monitoring and Reporting Program requires you to implement the monitoring program on the effective date of coverage under this permit. All monitoring reports should be sent to the Regional Board, <u>ATTN: Information Technology Unit.</u> Please note that the Executive Officer may require you to develop and implement a groundwater monitoring program based on the results of the technical information pertaining to your septic disposal system.

When submitting monitoring or technical reports to the Regional Board per these requirements, please include a reference to "Compliance File No. CI-8568", which will assure that the reports

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are directed to the appropriate file and staff. Also, please do not combine other reports with your monitoring reports. Submit each type of report as a separate document.

We are sending a copy of Order No. 97-10-DWQ with Attachments A and B only to the applicant. A copy of the Order will be furnished to anyone who requests it.
