GENERAL WASTE DISCHARGE PERMIT ENROLLMENT UNDER GENERAL WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR RESIDENTIAL ONSITE WASTEWATER TREATMENT SYSTEMS (ORDER NO. R4-2004-0146; SERIES 001): 127 PALOMARES AVENUE, VENTURA, CA 93003 (FILE NO. 04-208, CI-8845)

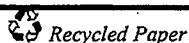
We have received your Notice of Intent dated December 21, 2004 for enrollment under the Regional Board Order No. R4-2004-0146 General Waste Discharge Requirements for Residential Onsite Wastewater Treatment Systems. You have proposed to install a new 1500-gallon septic tank, which in turn will discharge wastewater after primary separation into an existing 4 feet (ft) X 40 ft. seepage pit. During a boring to a depth of 50 feet below ground surface, groundwater was not encountered.

Regional Board staff have reviewed the information provided and have determined that the proposed discharge meets the conditions specified in Order No. R4-2004-0146, General Waste Discharge Requirements for Residential Onsite Wastewater Treatment Systems, adopted by the Regional Board on September 2, 2004. Please note that we have determined that your discharge is "Low-risk".

Enclosed are your Waste Discharge Requirements, consisting of Order No. R4-2004-0146. Dischargers meeting the Low-risk criteria must comply with the Discharge Prohibitions, General Provisions and Compliance and Enforcement provisions of parts D, E, and I and the Standard Provisions of Order No. R4-2004-0146. In addition, you are required to comply with any local agency requirements with respect to septic systems and wastewater disposal.

Although your discharge is enrolled under the General Permit, it will be reviewed periodically. Based on the technical information pertaining to your septic disposal system and/or groundwater, the Regional Board Executive Officer (Executive Officer) may require further technical information, including a monitoring program. Once such decision is made, you will be notified within 30 days before any Board action. Should changes to your septic disposal system be needed, engineering drawings showing the change must be filed with the Regional Board a minimum of thirty days prior to the change. In addition, the change is subject to the review and approval of the City of Ventura, Inspection Service Division.


