**REVISED COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS – ONE WORLD TRADE CENTER., SUITE 198, LONG BEACH, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG994004, CI-9201)**

Our letter dated November 8, 2006, transmitted a permit to discharge treated groundwater from the above referenced site under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES). We determined that the groundwater discharge from above referenced site flows into a nearby storm drain thence, to Los Angeles River Estuary. Therefore, the discharge limitations in Attachment B of Order No. R4-2003-0111 are not applicable to your discharge. The Fact Sheet and Monitoring and Reporting Program have been revised to reflect the changes.

The subsurface flow from the above referenced site will be pumped, treated, and discharged to the storm drain on a continuous basis. You propose to discharge up to 36,000 gallons per day of groundwater from the site.

Based on the attached Fact Sheet and other information provided, we have determined that the proposed discharge at the above-referenced site meets the conditions to be regulated under Order No. R4-2003-0111, *General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit and Waste Discharge Requirements for Groundwater Discharges from Construction and Project Dewatering to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties*, adopted by this Board on August 7, 2003.

Enclosed are your Waste Discharge Requirements, which also serve as your NPDES permit, consisting of Order No. R4-2003-0111 and Monitoring and Reporting Program No. CI-9201. The discharge limitations in Part E.1.a. of Order No. R4-2003-0111 for the specific constituents listed on the Table with the enclosed Fact Sheet are applicable to your discharge. Prior to starting discharge, a representative sample of the effluent must be obtained and analyzed to determine compliance with the discharge limitations.

The Monitoring and Reporting Program requires you to implement the monitoring program on the effective date of coverage under this permit. All monitoring reports should be sent to the Regional Board, ATTN: Information Technology Unit. When submitting monitoring or technical reports to

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the Regional Board per these requirements, please include a reference to "Compliance File No. CI-9201 and NPDES No. CAG994004", which will assure that the reports are directed to the appropriate file and staff. Also, please do not combine other reports with your monitoring reports. Submit each type of report as a separate document.

In order to avoid future annual fees, please submit written notification when the project has been completed and the permit is no longer needed.

We are sending a copy of Order No. R4-2003-0111 only to the applicant.
