## TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS—WEST BASIN MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT, EDWARD C. LITTLE WATER RECYCLING FACILITY, 1935 HUGHES WAY, EL SEGUNDO, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG674001, CI–9328)

The subject discharge is regulated under Order No. R4-2009-0068, *Waste Discharge Requirements and General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit for Discharges of Low Threat Hydrostatic Test Water to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties*, adopted by this Board on June 4, 2009.

We have reviewed your letter dated June 17, 2019, requesting termination of your coverage under the General Permit. The letter indicated that your office has adopted a procedure to haul off any water used to pressurize new pipelines and reuse this water at its water recycling facility. Therefore, the coverage under the subject NPDES permit for the discharge from the above-referenced facility to surface water is no longer needed. Since there is no discharge of wastewater from the facility, coverage under Board Order R4-2009-0068, General NPDES Permit No. CAG674001 for the facility is hereby terminated, except for enforcement purposes.

Please note that if future discharges of groundwater to surface waters or land become necessary, you must file a Report of Waste Discharge with this Board and obtain appropriate waste discharge requirements. If you have any questions, please contact Gensen Kai at (213) 576–6651.
