## PROJECT DESCRIPTION

KAF Investments, LLC (KAF) proposes to discharge groundwater from their 8833 Cynthia Street Condo Building located at 8833 Cynthia Street, west Hollywood, California. Dewatering is necessary to protect the integrity of the building structure at the facility from rising groundwater. Based on the information provided, the proposed discharge of groundwater meets the conditions to be regulated under General Permit No. CAG994004, Order No. R4-2008-0032; General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit and Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharge of Groundwater From Construction and Project Dewatering to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties, adopted by this Board on June 5, 2008. The pumped groundwater will be tested prior to discharge to the storm drain.

### **VOLUME AND DESCRIPTION OF DISCHARGE**

Up to 1,000 gallons per day (gpd) of treated groundwater will be discharged to a local storm drain at Latitude 33°57'37", Longitude 118°27'33", which drains to the Ballona Creek, a water of the United States. The site location map is shown as Figure 1.

### APPLICABLE EFFLUENT LIMITATIONS

Based on the information provided in the NPDES Application Supplemental Requirements, the following constituents listed in the Table below have been determined to show reasonable potential to exist in the discharge. The groundwater discharged from the subject site flows into the Ballona Creek. Therefore, discharge limitations specified in Attachment B of Order No. R4-2008-0032 are not applicable to the discharge.

It is not economically feasible to haul the groundwater for off-site disposal. It is not feasible to discharge the water to the sanitary sewer system. There are no other feasible reuse options for the discharge. Therefore, the treated groundwater will be discharged to the storm drain in compliance with the requirements of the attached order.

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
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
