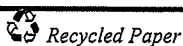
DESCRIPTION: Proposed amendment reconsiders adoption of a Total Maximum Daily Load for metals in the Los Angeles River and its tributaries

This notice is to advise any interested parties that the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Los Angeles Region, will reconsider adoption of an amendment to the Water Quality Control Plan for a Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) to reduce metals in the Los Angeles River and its tributaries. Consideration of the proposed resolution will be at a public hearing to be held on September 6, 2007 at the City of San Buenaventura, Council Chambers, 501 Poli Street, San Buenaventura, California. Actions to amend the Water Quality Control Plan for the Los Angeles Region will be taken in accordance with a regulatory program exempt under Section 21080.5 of the Public Resources Code from the requirement to prepare an environmental impact report under the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.) and with other applicable laws and regulations.
