NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

PROPOSED REISSUANCE OF WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS (National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit)

Calleguas Municipal Water District (hereinafter, Discharger) discharges treated effluent from publicly-owned treatment works (POTWs) and concentrates from brackish groundwater desalter plants and wastewater treatment facilities across the Calleguas Creek Watershed through the Regional Salinity Management Pipeline (hereinafter, RSMP or Facility) into the Pacific Ocean, a water of the United States. The discharge was previously regulated by Order No. R4-2014-0033-A01, adopted and became effective on July 9, 2015. Order No. R4-2014-0033-A01 expired on April 30, 2019, and also served as a permit under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Program (NPDES No. CA0064521). The Discharger filed a Report of Waste Discharge (ROWD) on November 19, 2018, and applied to the Regional Water Board for the reissuance of waste discharge requirements (WDRs) and an NPDES permit for the discharge. Pursuant to California Code of Regulations, title 23, section 2235.4, the terms and conditions of an expired permit are automatically continued pending reissuance of the permit if the Discharger complies with all federal NPDES requirements for continuation of expired permits. The Discharger has complied with these requirements.

The Discharger is a wholesale water supplier to cities and unincorporated areas in south Ventura County and east of the Santa Clara River. The Discharger is the owner and operator of the RSMP, which began to discharge to the Pacific Ocean in September 2014. It currently extends from Camarillo to the Pacific Ocean at Port Hueneme. The RSMP collects, transports, and discharges treated effluent from publicly-owned treatment works (POTWs), and concentrates from brackish groundwater desalter plants and wastewater treatment facilities. The RSMP is also used to transport recycled water from the City of Oxnard's Advanced Water Purification Facility (AWPF) to the Pleasant Valley County Water District's (PVCWD) irrigation distribution system until a permanent connection can be constructed or additional flows into the RSMP render the option infeasible, whichever comes first. The discharge from the RSMP to the PVCWD irrigation distribution system and to the irrigation systems of two individual growers on the Oxnard Plain is authorized separately by the water recycling requirements (WRRs) and waste discharge requirements (WDRs) Order No. R4-2011-0079-A02, which was issued to the City of Oxnard. The RSMP discharges into the Pacific Ocean through Discharge Point 001 (Latitude 34.1430° N. Longitude 119.1927° W) via the Hueneme Outfall located at the vicinity of the Port Hueneme Beach. Operation of the RSMP is intended to reduce salt loadings to the

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Calleguas Creek Watershed by diverting treated municipal wastewater and saline concentrates for discharge into the Pacific Ocean. Construction of the RSMP extension is ongoing, and is designed to extend through the Santa Rosa and Simi Valley areas.

On the basis of preliminary staff review and application of lawful standards and regulations, the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Los Angeles Region, tentatively proposes to issue waste discharge requirements, including effluent limitations and special conditions.

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Ex Parte Communications Prohibited: As a quasi-adjudicative proceeding, no board member may discuss the subject of this hearing with any person, except during the public hearing itself. Any communications to the Regional Water Board must be directed to staff.

PUBLIC COMMENTS AND SUBMITTAL OF EVIDENCE

Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the tentative waste discharge requirements, or submit evidence for the Board to consider, are invited to submit them in writing to the above address. To be evaluated and responded to by staff, included in the Board's agenda folder, and fully considered by the Board, written comments and evidence must be submitted to losangeles@waterboards.ca.gov with a copy to Ching-Yin.To@waterboards.ca.gov no later than close of business on **May 16, 2019**. Please reference the comments as "Comments on tentative NPDES Permit, Calleguas Municipal Water District, Regional Salinity Management Pipeline, CA0064521". Comments or evidence received after that date will not be accepted or included in the administrative record without express approval of the Chair during the hearing and will not be included if to do so would prejudice any party or the Board. Additionally, if the Board receives only supportive comments, the permit may be placed on the Board's consent calendar, and approved without oral testimony.

HEARING PROCEDURE

The meeting, in which the hearing will be a part of, will start at 9:00 a.m. Interested persons are invited to attend. Staff will present the matter under consideration, after which oral statements from parties or interested persons will be heard. For accuracy of the record, all important testimony should be in writing. The Board will include in the administrative record written transcriptions of oral testimony that is actually presented at the hearing. Oral testimony may be limited to 3 minutes maximum or less for each speaker, depending on the number of persons

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wishing to be heard. Parties or persons with similar concerns or opinions are encouraged to choose one representative to speak. At the conclusion of testimony, the Board will deliberate in open or close session, and render a decision.

Parties or persons with special procedural requests should contact staff. Any procedure not specified in this hearing notice will be waived pursuant to section 648(d) of title 23 of the California Code of Regulations. Objections to any procedure to be used during this hearing must be submitted in writing not later than close of business 15 business days prior to the date of the hearing. Procedural objections will not be entertained at the hearing.

If there should not be a quorum on the scheduled date of this meeting, this case will be automatically continued to the next scheduled meeting in July 2019. A continuance will not extend any time set forth herein.
