**NOTICE OF PROPOSED ISSUANCE OF  
WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS  
(National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit)**

The Joint Outfall System (JOS), formerly referred to as Los Angeles County Sanitation District is currently discharging tertiary-treated effluent, from its Pomona Water Reclamation Plant (Pomona WRP) to the South Fork San Jose Creek, a water of the United States, tributary to the San Gabriel River. The discharge is regulated under waste discharge requirements contained in Order No. R4-2014-0212, adopted by the California Regional Water Quality Control Board Los Angeles Region (Los Angeles Water Board), on November 06, 2014. This Order was amended on July 09, 2015 by Order No. R4-2014-0212-A01. Order No. R4-2014-0212-A01 serves as a permit under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES No. CA0053619). The Discharger filed a report of waste discharge (ROWD) and applied for reissuance of its Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) and NPDES permit on June 25, 2019, to discharge tertiary-treated effluent. Supplemental information was requested on September 25, 2019 and received on October 23, 2019. The application was deemed complete on December 3, 2019. The terms and conditions of the current NPDES order have been automatically continued and remain in effect until new WDRs and NPDES permit are adopted pursuant to this Order.

JOS owns and operates the Pomona WRP, a publicly owned treatment works (POTW), located at 295 Humane Way, Pomona, California, with a design capacity of 15.0 million gallons per day (MGD). The treatment system consists of comminution, primary sedimentation, flow equalization, activated sludge biological treatment with nitrification and de-nitrification (NDN) for nitrogen removal, secondary sedimentation, filtration, chloramination, and dechlorination (sodium bisulfite). The Pomona WRP and six other POTWs are part of an integrated network of facilities, known as the JOS. The JOS, which consists of approximately 1,200 miles of interceptors and trunk sewers, serves an urban area of 654 square miles, including all or parts of 73 cities in addition to multiple communities and unincorporated areas, within Los Angeles County. Sewage solids, separated from the Pomona WRP's wastewater are returned to the JOS trunk sewer for conveyance to Joint Water Pollution Control Plant (JWPCP) for treatment and disposal, under a separate NPDES Order. Tertiary-treated effluent is discharged from the Pomona WRP from Discharge Point 001 (Latitude 34.0552 N, Longitude -117.7955 W) to the South Fork San Jose Creek, tributary to the San Gabriel River, waters of the United States, within San Gabriel River Watershed.

On the basis of preliminary staff review and application of lawful standards and regulations, the Los Angeles Water Board tentatively proposes to issue waste discharge requirements, including effluent limitations and special conditions.

The entire file will become a part of the administrative record of this proceeding, irrespective of whether individual documents are specifically referenced during the hearing. The entire file will not be present in the hearing room. Should any interested persons desire staff to bring to the hearing any particular documents that are not included in the agenda packet, they must submit a written or electronic request to staff during business hours, not later than 5 business days before the hearing. The request must identify the documents with enough specificity for staff to locate them.

### **NATURE OF HEARING**

This will be a formal adjudicative hearing pursuant to section 648 et seq. of title 23 of the California Code of Regulations. Chapter 5 of the California Administrative Procedure Act (commencing with section 11500 of the Government Code) will not apply to this proceeding.

*Ex Parte Communications Prohibited:* As a quasi-adjudicative proceeding, no board member may discuss the subject of this hearing with any person, except during the public hearing itself. Any communications to the Los Angeles Water Board must be directed to staff.

### **PUBLIC COMMENTS AND SUBMITTAL OF EVIDENCE**

Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the tentative waste discharge requirements, or submit evidence for the Board to consider, are invited to submit them in writing to the above address. To be evaluated and responded to by staff, included in the Board's agenda folder, and fully considered by the Board, written comments must be submitted to the Los Angeles Water Board staff at [losangeles@waterboards.ca.gov](mailto:losangeles@waterboards.ca.gov) with a copy submitted to Veronica Cuevas at [Veronica.Cuevas@waterboards.ca.gov](mailto:Veronica.Cuevas@waterboards.ca.gov) no later than 5:00 p.m. on **May 14, 2021**. Comments or evidence received after that date may be submitted, to the Board for consideration, but only included in administrative record with express approval of the Chair. Additionally, if the Board receives only supportive comments, the permit may be placed on the Board's consent calendar and approved without oral testimony.

### **HEARING PROCEDURE**

The meeting, in which the hearing will be a part of, will start at 9:00 a.m. Interested persons are invited to attend. Staff will present the matter under consideration, after which oral statements from parties or interested persons will be heard. For accuracy of the record, all important testimony should be in writing. The Board will include in the administrative record written transcriptions of oral testimony that is presented at the hearing. Oral testimony may be limited to three minutes maximum or less for each speaker, depending on the number of persons wishing to be heard. Parties or persons with similar concerns or opinions are encouraged to choose one representative to speak. At the conclusion of testimony, the Board will deliberate in open or close session, and render a decision.

Parties or persons with special procedural requests should contact staff. Any procedure not specified in this hearing notice will be waived pursuant to section 648(d) of title 23 of the California Code of Regulations. Objections to any procedure to be used during this hearing must be submitted in writing not later than close of business fifteen business days prior to the date of the hearing. Procedural objections will not be entertained at the hearing.

If there should not be a quorum on the scheduled date of this meeting, this case will be automatically continued to the next scheduled meeting on **July 8, 2021**. A continuance will not extend any time set forth herein.
