Ventura County Superintendents of School's Facilities Network Meeting

Enrique Loera

A meeting was organized by Anita Kuhlman of the city of Camarillo to discuss stormwater pollution prevention measures and other items related to the State Industrial Permit as they apply to schools. The meeting took place on October 21, 2009. Enrique Loera of the Stormwater and Enforcement Unit gave a presentation. The following topics were covered:

- When the Industrial General Permit applies.
- When The Construction General Permit applies.
- Best Management Practices (BMPs) recommendations (source control and treatment control)
- Typical violations
- Inspection forms used
- New Construction and Industrial General Permit Status

Watershed Management

Watershed Stakeholder Activities

Nine of the ten watershed management areas in the Los Angeles Region have extensive stakeholder involvement (represented by agencies, individuals, businesses, and nonprofit organizations) in watershed and subwatershed activities including development of planning documents and implementation of restoration projects. Major watershed activities involving multiple stakeholders include participation in the Integrated Regional Water Management Plan process to address areawide water supply, water quality, and open space issues; and development and implementation of various water quality and wetlands restoration plans such as is occurring at Colorado Lagoon in Long Beach and at Ormond Beach Wetlands in Ventura County. Watershed Management Initiative Chapter

Each Regional Board has a "chapter" in a statewide document which describes the Region's watersheds and their priority water quality issues. Updates occur as needed; the last update occurred in December 2007. The 2007 document can be downloaded at http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/losangeles/water issues/ programs/regional program/index.shtml#Watershed. In addition, there is a clickable map of the region's watersheds for information specific to each one including State of Watershed Reports, where available, and lists of permits and impaired waters.

Funding

Information on a wide variety of funding sources is available on the California Watershed Funding Database website at http://calwatershedfunds.org/. Both Los Angeles and Ventura Counties have developed Integrated Regional Water Management Plans (IRWMPs) in order to qualify for funding under Propositions 50 and 84. The Los Angeles County IRWMP may be viewed at http://www.lawaterplan.org/ which also includes information on meeting schedules and summaries. The Greater LA Region is composed of five subregions which conduct separate steering committee meetings. The Ventura County IRWMP is available at http://www.watershedscoalition.org/ which also includes information on meeting schedules and summaries. Committees/councils for the County's watersheds generally meet on a monthly basis. The Watersheds Coalition of Ventura County meets as a combined group less frequently. Stakeholders in the upper Santa Clara River watershed have developed a separate IRWMP which is available at http://www.scrwaterplan.org.

Landfills Unit

<u>Clean Closure of an Illegal Waste Disposal Site at Santa Catalina Island</u> Wen Yang

In a letter dated October 19, 2009, to Santa Catalina Island Company (land owner), the Executive Officer approved clean closure of an illegal waste disposal site that is located at 13 Roaring Canyon Road, Santa

Catalina Island. In April 2009, during excavation to prepare the site for use as a container storage facility, solid wastes that had been illegally disposed of at the Site, including scrap metal, concrete, tires, automotive batteries, and other household debris, were encountered. To ensure that all such non-hazardous and potentially hazardous wastes are removed from the site, the land owner proposed remediation that included the identification and complete removal of all solid wastes and any contaminated soil.

Remediation at the site was conducted from June to August 2009, under the supervision of the Los Angeles County Department Public Health Local Enforcement Agency (LEA). Regional Board staff worked closely with the LEA by reviewing the workplan and final remediation report and conducting an inspection. Based on the information provided by the land owner and the LEA and the observations made during the inspection, staff determined that all illegally discharged solid wastes at the site had been removed and hauled for proper offsite disposal. Remediation at the site therefore meets the requirements of California Code of Regulations, Title 27 (27 CCR), Section 21810, for clean closure.

Malibu Septic Prohibition

Most of the Landfill staff was re-directed since July to support efforts by the Groundwater Permitting staff as they finalized tech memos, reviewed CEQA comments, and prepared responses to comments. The Landfill staff added much value to the final product.

Groundwater Permitting Unit—(Non Chapter 15)

Sanitation at Surfrider Beach

Toni Callaway

On February 25, 2003, the Regional Board enrolled the County of Los Angeles under a general WDR for the comfort station at Surfrider Beach. Shortly after commencement of the groundwater monitoring program required under the WDR, the County found bacteria in excess of limits set in accordance with the *Ocean Plan*. In 2006, the leachfield failed, and the County has been using the existing septic tank as a holding tank and hauling raw sewage for offsite for disposal. Last month, the City of Malibu notified the County that plans for upgrade of the septic system, including relocation of the leachfield, have been approved, and the County plans to proceed immediately with the upgrade, as this is a less costly alternative to hauling during interim period before the prohibition on existing discharges in the Malibu Civic Center area becomes effective in 2015.

For the case closure sites above, a total of **3,696** tons of impacted soils were excavated and **236,129** pounds of hydrocarbons were removed by soil vapor extraction system. In addition, **705,779** gallons of impacted groundwater were treated.

Executive Officer issued general Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) Yue Rong

The Executive Officer, on behalf of the board, issued 1 general Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) to Tujunga Wells #6 and #7 of City of Los Angeles (11/2/09). The WDRs issued for re-injection of treated groundwater as a pilot study to restore the water supply from these two wells.

Enforcement Unit

NPDES Facility Inspections

Enforcement Unit NPDES inspector conducted inspections at 9 facilities with NPDES Permits since November 5, 2009. Inspection of these facilities is a required part of the NPDES program.

13267 Order:

A 13267 Order to Submit Information Letter was issued to the City of South Pasadena on October 23, 2009 for the October 10, 2009 unpermitted discharge of raw sewage at 1020 Arroyo Verde Road in South Pasadena, CA. The Discharger has until November 19, 2009 to submit the required information and report to the Regional Board.

ACL Complaint for MMP:

Complaint for mandatory minimum penalty No. R4-2008-0165-M was issued to Venoco, Inc. (Permittee) on October 30, 2009 in the amount of \$3,000 for alleged violations of Regional Board Order No. R4-2003-0111, NPDES Permit No. CAG994004. The Permittee has until November 20, 2009 to respond.

Complaint Order No. R4-2009-0135-M was issued to St. Vincent Medical Center on October 30, 2009, S. Mark Taper Foundation Transplant Center located at 2200 West Third Street, Los Angeles, California, for violating waste discharge requirements contained in Regional Board Order No. R4-2003-0111.
