Update on the July 11, 2021 Hyperion Treatment Plant Incident

Regional Water Board staff continue to closely monitor the Hyperion Treatment Plant (Hyperion) following the July 11, 2021, unauthorized discharge of raw sewage incident. Per the Regional Water Board's August 2, 2021, Amended Order No. R4-2021-0170-A01 Requirement for Monitoring and Status Reports, Regional Water Board staff receive and review daily updates regarding efforts made to repair and replace equipment, restore the treatment process to normal operation, effluent monitoring and offshore monitoring data.

As indicated by the daily reports submitted, almost all treatment processes are online with the anticipation of all equipment operational by the end of September 2021. As of September 15, the Effluent Pumping Plant (EPP) pumps are back in operation. Beginning September 1, effluent monitoring data for total suspended solids (TSS), biochemical oxygen demand (BOD), settleable solids, and turbidity have been below their respective average weekly and instantaneous maximum limits. Upon request from LASAN and after consideration of the recent effluent quality improvements and the progress made in the restoration of the plant equipment and processes, the Regional Water Board Executive Officer has issued an Amended Order No. R4-2021-0170-A02 on September 17 that reduces the offshore monitoring frequency from 7 days a week to 3 days a week (Monday, Wednesday, Friday).

Regarding offshore bacteria monitoring, based on the water quality data thus far along with information on the ocean currents, it is unlikely that elevated levels of bacteria discharged from the 5-mile outfall are impacting beach water quality.

On August 24 and 25, Regional Water Board staff conducted a multi-agency investigation

at the Hyperion Treatment Plant and its associated collection system. Results of that investigation are pending. On September 15, Regional Water Board staff began a Pretreatment Compliance Audit of the City of Los Angeles' pretreatment program for Hyperion and the City's other wastewater treatment plants. The audit is ongoing.

Staff continue to be in regular communication with several affected agencies including the City of El Segundo, County Department of Public Health and West Basin Municipal Water District.

Settlement Agreement and Stipulation for Entry of Administrative Civil Liability Order No. R4-2016-0316 (Stipulated Order), City of Industry, Follows Camp

On September 21, 2016, the Executive Officer executed the Stipulated Order on behalf of the Regional Water Board with the City of Industry for alleged violations of the Clean Water Act and the California Water Code. The alleged violations occurred when the City engaged in unpermitted grading activities that resulted in the unauthorized discharge of dredged and/or fill material in the Eastern Fork of the San Gabriel River in May 2012. Pursuant to the Stipulated Order, the City agreed to pay \$5,000,000 in administrative penalties, of which \$2,500,000 was paid in full to the State Water Pollution Cleanup and Abatement Account (CAA) on February 10, 2017. The remaining \$2,500,000 was to be suspended pending completion of an enhanced compliance action (ECA) in accordance with the implementation schedule included in the Stipulated Order. In June 2021, the City determined that the ECA deadlines to complete the ECA were no longer feasible due to repeated delays in the acquisition of property on which to construct the ECA and requested to pay the remaining \$2,500,000 in liability. On August 11, 2021, the Regional Water Board issued a Notice of Violation to the City for its failure to complete the ECA as required by the Stipulated Order and demanded a payment of the outstanding liability. The City completed payment of the suspended liability of \$2,500,000 to the CAA on September 17, 2021.

Remediation Section

Former Kast Property Tank Farm, Carousel Tract Residential Neighborhood, Carson - Dr. Teklewold Ayalew, (213) 576-6739 Site Cleanup Unit III

Activities related to site investigation and cleanup work performed during August 2021 include the following:

1. Cleanup of 203 (~72 %) properties is complete. As of August 31, 2021, the status of the cleanup at the Carousel Tract is as follows:

Cluster 18

- a. All remediation work is complete including remedial excavations and installation of remediation systems where applicable.
- b. Construction of the new property line block walls is complete.
- c. Grading of six properties is completed and the properties were turned over to restoration contractors, and the remaining six will be turned over to restoration contractors on September 7th.
- d. Installation of drainage pipes and preparation for hardscaping are currently underway; and
- e. All work is proceeding on schedule no change to the projected completion dates for remediation on cluster 18 homes.

Cluster 19

- a. Demolition and removal of all hardscape and landscape is complete on all yards.
- b. Work, on yards that require excavation continued into the week of August 16, 2021 and is now approximately 40% complete.
- c. Installation of remediation systems will start the week of September 20th.

Former Athens Tank Farm / Ujima Village Apartments and Ervin Magic Johnson Regional Park (EMJRP), Los Angeles - Dr. Teklewold Ayalew, (213) 576-6739 Site Cleanup Unit III

Activities related to environmental site investigation of the Former Athens Tank Farm during August 2021 are summarized below:

- A summary of ongoing and upcoming Redevelopment Activities by the County of Los Angeles of the Ervin Magic Johnson Regional Park (EMJRP)/Former Ujima Village Apartments (UVA) Phase 1B project follows:
 - a. Access issues to landscaped areas of the Phase 1B area resulted in delays in sampling soil vapor probes associated with the Phase II SVE performance monitoring. Sampling soil vapor probes is scheduled to be completed by late September 2021;
 - b. Access issues to groundwater monitoring wells resulted in delays to sampling monitoring wells TF-4/ATF-5 located in the Phase 1B area. Groundwater samples from ATF-4 and ATF-5 were collected in the week of August 23, 2021.
- 2. Ongoing and upcoming activities for the former Athens Tank Farm site are as follows:

Phase I Soil Vapor Extraction (SVE)

a. Continue extracting from wells SVE-02 and SVE-11 using the Phase II SVE system.

Phase II SVE

- a. The system is operating and currently extracting from wells HRW-201 (all 3 screens), HRW-202A, HRW-204AB, HRW-205AB, HRW-206B and HRW-207A and from Phase I wells SVE-02 and SVE-11.
- b. The Phase II SVE system manual switch for the knock-out pot pump was installed on August 27, 2021; and
- c. The Phase II SVE system is operated intermittently when field staff are on-site and can monitor system operation due to delays in obtaining a replacement temperature controller. COVID-19 related factory shutdowns resulted in a shortage of outside vendor supplied components.
- d. As of June 30, 2021, cumulated removals to date are approximately 644,662 pounds of VOCs and 106,538 pounds of methane from both SVE systems.

Phase III Systems

NAPL Recovery Trailer

- a. The NAPL Recovery Trailer is currently operating on wells ATF-19B, ATF-21B and ATF-28B;
- b. The NAPL Trailer is currently positioned over well ATF-19B:
 - i. NAPL Tier I cumulative recovery, as of June 30, 2021, is 1,900 gallons using NAPL Recovery Trailer; and
 - ii. NAPL Tier II recovery as of June 30, 2021 is 288 gallons using manual bailing.

Air/Bio-Sparge System

The system is operating and collecting system performance data.

Regional Water Board Staff speaks at Western Groundwater Congress 2021

On September 13, 2021, Dr. Yue Rong presented a case study for groundwater monitoring and remediation in Los Angeles region at the Western Groundwater Congress 2021, hosted by the Groundwater Resources Association of California (GRA). GRA is a professional association dedicated to groundwater resources management through education and technical leadership. The conference was attended by groundwater professionals and technical personnel in the industry.

York Park Committee Listening Session

On September 15, 2021, Regional Water Board staff participated in a virtual community with members of the Highland Park Neighborhood Council's York Park Committee to address questions about the remediation and closure of a former gasoline station located at 4954 York Boulevard. A representative Staff from the Los Angeles City Department of Recreation and Parks also attended. Regional Water Board staff Dr. Arman Toumari presented information on the history of the site, the investigation and remediation activity conducted under the Board's oversight, and the subsequent case closure granted by the Regional Water Board in 2011. The presentation was followed by a question-and-answer session with the Committee. Based on the discussion, Board staff volunteered to provide a tutorial to Committee members on use of the State's publicly available GeoTracker database, which contains information on the status of cleanups under the Board's regulatory oversight. and to walk them through the State Board's Low Threat Closure Policy for underground storage tanks.

Los Angeles County Preliminary Draft Revised Countywide Siting Element and Draft Environmental Impact Report Wen Yang

Staff of the Regional Water Board Land Disposal Program reviewed the Preliminary Draft Revised Countywide Siting Element and Draft Environmental Impact Report provided by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Works. The draft documents have been prepared to meet the requirements of the California Integrated Waste Management Act of 1989 (also known as AB 939) that requires each county to prepare a countywide siting element that describes how the county and the cities within the county plan to manage the disposal of their solid waste for a 15-year planning period. The existing Los Angeles County Countywide Siting Element (CSE) was published in 1997. The Preliminary Draft Revised CSE document describes each of the existing and planned solid waste disposal and management sites available for use by jurisdictions in Los Angeles County, and offers goals, policies, and strategies through which current and future solid waste management infrastructure needs can be met in a comprehensive and environmentally sustainable manner. It is noted that no new landfills, or expansions of existing ones, are planned within the County of Los Angeles over the next 15 years.

Regional Programs Section

Municipal Stormwater (MS4) Permitting Program

The Regional MS4 Permit for Los Angeles and Ventura Counties, which was adopted by the Regional Water Board on July 23, 2021, went into effect on September 11, 2021. Board staff is in the process of reviewing the updated Reasonable Assurance Analyses (RAA), which were submitted by MS4 permittees in Los Angeles County that are participating in an approved Watershed Management Program.

On September 23, 2021, Regional Water Board staff attended a virtual North Santa Monica Bay Watershed Community Meeting "A Program of the Safe, Clean Water Program, Funded by Measure W and the Voters of Los Angeles County." Watershed Coordinator Melina Sempill Watts spoke about how the Safe Clean Water Program would work to improve water quality in the North Santa Monica Bay watershed. The program included presentations from local agencies such as the County of Los Angeles, the Regional Water Board and the National Park Service on water quality issues in the watershed. Additional presentations concerned potential methods to source water locally such as rain collection from roofs and fog water collection.

TMDL Program

On September 21, 2021, the State Water Board approved the Regional Water Board's action to amend the Basin Plan to revise certain final deadlines for nine TMDLs with near-term deadlines between 2021-2023.

Staff met with the National Forest Foundation local representative on August 26, 2021 to discuss the implementation of restoration activities on National Forest System lands in the Elizabeth Lake drainage area in response to damage from the 2013 Powerhouse Fire. Specific proposed actions may include restoring wetland habitat and native grasslands around Elizabeth Lake, developing habitat restoration showcases, and/or removing lake sediment. Lake sediment was identified as the main nonpoint source of pollution in the Santa Clara River Lakes Nutrient TMDL and removal of lake sediment would address the impairment of water quality. The TMDL compliance deadline for internal loading for Elizabeth Lake and the adjacent Lake Hughes is June 27, 2032.

Watershed Regulatory Section

Regional Water Board staff attended the two-day virtual meeting that was convened by the Direct Potable Reuse (DPR) Criteria Expert Panel on August 24 and 25, 2021. The DPR Criteria Expert Panel is comprised of experts from universities, consulting firms, and state and federal agencies. DDW staff provided presentations regarding the statutory mandate of AB 574, overview of regulation development, drinking water regulations and draft criteria and the process for formally adopting new regulations. The timeline for adoption of DPR regulation is as follows: 1) obtain the Expert Panel findings in 2022; 2) start the rulemaking process in 2023; 3) determine if an 18-month extension is needed by June 30, 2023; and 4) adopt the regulations by December 31, 2023 if no extension is needed. A briefing regarding the Water Research Foundation (WRF) research projects was also provided, explaining what chemicals break through the full advanced treatment train (MF/RO/UV-AOP) causing chemical peaks and possible options for managing those peaks.

Regional Water Board attended a community stakeholder meeting with the Santa Susana Stormwater Expert Panel on August 19, 2021. The Santa Susana Stormwater Expert Panel is an independent committee that has been providing guidance to the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board and the Boeing Company as required by the NPDES Permit since 2008. The August 19th meeting was to provide an update on recent stormwater sampling results and management activities at the Site. Due to the lack of rain during the 2020-2021 season, flow was not observed, and limited data was available for updates. A review of historical trends was provided, along with an update on BMP activities across the site related to measures taken around telephone poles. The results of the lead isotope analysis on Shooting Range material in the Northern Drainage is still pending. This data will support source analysis for the Northern Drainage areas.
