Acting Chair Stahl welcomed everyone to the meeting. He thanked Mayor Velma Cuellar Stallings and Paramount City Council members for allowing the Board to use the City's council chambers.

Acting Chair Stahl called the meeting to order at 9:07 a.m.

Item 5 - Board Member Communications

a. Ex Parte Disclosures (Board Members identified any discussions they had requiring disclosure pursuant to Government Code section 11430.40.)

b. Board Member Reports:

Board Member Camacho reported on August 24, 2022 she attended a Meet and Greet with Bruce Resnick and Ben Harris (Los Angeles Waterkeeper) and Annelisa Moe (Heal the Bay).

Board Member Muñoz reported on two telephone calls she received within the last month, one from Martha Guzman, the USEPA Region IX Regional Administrator and the other from the Secretary of the Interior, Deb Haaland. Both expressed interest in Board Member Muñoz's non-profit organization, Mujeres de la Tierra. On Monday, October 17, 2022, Board Member Muñoz will attend a meeting in Los Angeles with Regional Administrator Guzman and other members of the community.

Acting Chair Stahl reported on August 17, 2022 he attended the Santa Monica Bay Restoration Commission (SMBRC) Governing Board meeting. He requested an update at a future board meeting from Marissa Caringella or another staff member on the 2023 activities and work plan for the SMBRC.

On October 4, 2022 he participated in the Water Boards' Chairs' meeting virtually; the focus of the meeting was the State budget passed by the State Legislature.

Acting Chair Stahl mentioned the upcoming WQCC meeting scheduled on October 27 & 28, 2022, in Sacramento for all state and regional board members.

Board member Nahai reported he received an invitation to participate in the United Nations Water Conference scheduled for March 2023.

Item 6 – Appointment of a Committee to Nominate Regional Water Board Officers for the Remainder of 2022 and Calendar Year 2023

Board Member Stahl announced Board Members Norma Camacho and Michael Méndez as the Nominating Committee, which he appointed in his position as Acting Chair, for the selection of the Chair and Vice Chair for the remainder of 2022 and for the Calendar Year 2023.

Item 7 – Executive Officer's Report

The Executive Officer provided updates on the following items: (1) investigation into the source of benzene in two wells in Norwalk; (2) status of cleanup activities at the Garfield Express site in Lynwood, including planned community outreach; (3) three enforcement matters that were recently resolved; and (4) the Statewide Bacteria Summit held among the State and Regional Water Boards and CASQA member agencies, and the public workshop held in September 2022 to discuss approaches to indicator bacteria TMDLs in the region following the Board's adoption of the Los Cerritos Channel, Alamitos Bay and Colorado Lagoon Bacteria TMDL earlier this year.

Acting Chair Stahl opened the floor for Board member comments and questions. Board members asked questions and the Executive Officer and Assistant Executive Officer, Hugh Marley, responded.

Item 8 – Update from State Water Board Member Liaison, Laurel Firestone

The State Water Board Liaison provided an update on the following items: (1) celebration of the 10-year anniversary of the Human Right to Water legislation; (2) the Governor's Water Supply Strategy and related matters, including the status of urban water usage and conservation, and State Water Board actions and funding to support implementation of the Governor's strategy; and (3) the Racial Equity Action Plan, including the upcoming State Water Board workshop.

Acting Chair Stahl opened the floor for comments and questions from the Board members. Board Member Firestone addressed Board member questions and comments.
