Nonpoint Source Grant Program and Cleanup and Abatement Funds Available for Post-Fire Recovery

2018 Nonpoint Source Program (Clean Water Act Section 319) Funds and Cleanup and Abatement Account (CAA) Funds – both of these funding sources can be used for post-fire work. The 319 monies have a Feb 8, 2018 application deadline. The CAA is a continuous application process (no submittal deadline).

For CAA applications, projects up to \$250,000 that qualify can be administratively approved. Projects over that amount have to be approved by the State Water Board. State Water Board staff need about a 6-week lead time to get an item on the Board's agenda. There isn't a grant cap or match requirement, but there are limited funds in the CAA. For 319 projects, the grant cap is \$800,000 and the match can be waived for post-fire nonpoint source projects. An applicant must be a public agency, nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization, Federally Recognized Tribe, state agency, public college, or federal agency.
