Enclosed is Administrative Civil Liability Complaint No. R1-2023-0056 (Complaint) for the Loleta Community Services District (Discharger), issued by the Assistant Executive Officer of the California North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Water Board) in the matter of the Loleta Wastewater Treatment Facility (Facility). The Complaint covers the period from January 25, 2018, to June 30, 2023, and alleges that the Discharger violated effluent limitations set forth in Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) Orders No. R1-2014-0013 and R1-2020-0002 (National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System [NPDES] Permit No. CA0023671). The Complaint proposes that the alleged violations are subject to **\$555,000** in mandatory minimum penalties (MMPs) pursuant to Water Code section 13385, subdivisions (h) and/or (i) as well as Water Code section 13385.1 subdivision (a)(1), as identified in Exhibits A & B to the Complaint.

To help ensure the fairness and impartiality of this proceeding, the functions of those who will act in a prosecutorial role (Prosecution Team) by presenting evidence for consideration by the Regional Water Board have been separated from those who will provide advice to the Regional Water Board (Advisory Team) prior to and during the hearing. Any members of the Advisory Team who normally supervise any members of the Prosecution Team are not acting as their supervisors in this proceeding, and vice versa. Other members of the Prosecution Team may act or have acted as advisors to the Regional Water Board in other, unrelated matters, but they are not advising the Regional Water Board in this proceeding. The Prosecution Team is subject to all applicable rules and regulations as any other party to this proceeding, including the prohibition on ex parte communications.

Pursuant to Water Code section 13323, subdivision (b), the Regional Water Board shall hold a public hearing on this matter within 90 days after service of this Complaint. The Discharger may avoid or delay a hearing on the Complaint by selecting one of the following options on the enclosed Waiver Form and returning it to the Advisory Team, with a copy to the Prosecution Team, by the deadline specified in the Hearing Procedures, which will be provided to the parties by the Advisory Team following issuance of the Complaint. If you intend to waive your right to a hearing, I encourage you to sign and submit the waiver form as soon as possible.

- a. Waive the right to a hearing before the Regional Water Board and pay the proposed MMP of \$555,000 in full;
- b. Waive the right to a hearing before the Regional Water Board within 90 days after service of this Complaint to engage the Prosecution Team in settlement negotiations; or
- c. Waive the right to a hearing before the Regional Water Board within 90 days after service of the Complaint to extend the hearing date and/or hearing deadlines and allow additional time to prepare for hearing.

If you have any questions about the Waiver Form options or wish to request an extension to the deadline, you should contact the Advisory Team. Detailed hearing procedures and information regarding the hearing on the Complaint will be provided by the Advisory Team, as further explained below.

Additionally, a Fact Sheet is enclosed, along with the Complaint and attachments (Exhibits A, B, and C). The Fact Sheet describes the Complaint process and explains

what the Discharger can expect and the obligations as the process proceeds. **Please** read each document carefully.

An agenda containing the date, time, location, and specific procedures of the hearing will be sent to you by the Advisory Team prior to the hearing date, which will likely be scheduled to occur on either the first or second day of the Regional Water Board's regular meeting of December 12 & 13, 2023. The hearing will be governed by Hearing Procedures to be issued separately by the Advisory Team for use in adjudicating matters such as this one.

If the Discharger elects to pay the proposed administrative civil liability (as discussed above), this will be considered a tentative settlement of the violations. The settlement will be considered final pending a 30-day public comment period and approval by the Regional Water Board or Executive Officer. Interested parties may comment on the proposed action during this period by submitting written comments to the Regional Water Board staff person listed below. Should the Regional Water Board receive new information or comments during this comment period, the Assistant Executive Officer may withdraw the Complaint, return payment, and issue a new Complaint. If the Regional Water Board does not hold a hearing on this matter, and if the terms of the final settlement are not significantly different from those proposed in the enclosed Complaint, then there will not be additional opportunities for public comment on the proposed settlement.
