8. Consider a petition, submitted by Bill Crane, John and Annie Roberts, Margaret Rockwood, Marcia Hart, Madeleine Rose, and Ed Berger, requesting the Regional Water Board to assert its jurisdiction over **6875 Timber Drive, Sebastopol** to prohibit construction of a septic system on the property until the Regional Board approves a system that meets requirements of the Basin Plan and all other related policies and regulations. The Regional Board heard an update from staff on actions taken to address the arguments in the petition.

Luis Rivera introduced the item. He summarized the issues contained in the petition and updated the board on staff's actions and responses on the matter.

Workshop

9. Public Workshop and **CEQA Scoping Meeting** concerning the development of an amendment to the Regional Water Quality Control Plan for the North Coast Region to address Low Threat Discharge.

Staff re-introduced the low threat discharge amendment to both the Board and the interested public at a CEQA scoping meeting. Two members of the public, Russian River Watershed Protection Committee and the City of Santa Rosa, spoke in opposition of the proposed amendment. The City was concerned that the definition proposed for "low threat discharge" was unreasonable and would not be a useful clarification of the prohibition. The environmental spokesperson was concerned that the action would result in the revocation of the existing discharge prohibition(s) with a corresponding decrease in water quality. To date, 179 form letters in opposition, have been submitted to the Board.

Tom Dunbar stated that staff did not have a presentation and that those representing the City of Eureka were present to answer any questions.

PUBLIC HEARING Order No. R1-2007-0018, to consider adoption of an administrative civil liability order acknowledging penalty payment and specifying a compliance project to satisfy Administrative Civil Liability Complaint No. R1-2006-0034 issued on March 16, 2006 for violations of Waste Discharge Requirements Order Nos. 96-7 and R1-2001-60 adopted for **McKinleyville Community Services District, Wastewater Treatment Facility**, Humboldt County, WDID NO. 1B820840HUM.

Chairman Corbett recused himself from the item. Vice-Chair Anderson chaired the meeting. Tom Dunbar briefly introduced the item and stated that staff did not have a presentation. He introduced Tom Martin the general Manager of the McKinleyville Community Services District. Mr. Martin gave a brief overview of issues and stated that the District is back in compliance. He commended the Regional Water Board staff on working with the district.
