**Notice of Public Hearing**

On the basis of preliminary staff review and application of lawful standards and regulations, the North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Water Board) proposes to rescind the Waste Discharge Requirements Order No. R1-2017-0013 and MRP Order No. R1-2019-0048 for Virginia Dare Winery, Order No. R1-2014-0003 and MRP 2014-003 for Mendocino Forest Products Ukiah Sawmill, Order No. 94-085 and MRP 94-85 for Baywood Golf & Country Club, and Order No. 80-047 and MRP 80-47 for Timber Crest Farms. Regional Water Board staff have determined that the Orders listed above are no longer applicable, relevant or necessary and should be rescinded. Discharges regulated under these orders have either ceased or are now covered under new General Orders and/or the Onsite Wastewater Treatment Systems (OWTS) Policy.

This item will be open for public comment between **February 26, 2020 and March 27, 2020.**

## ***Public Hearing Procedures***

A public hearing to consider comments and objections to the proposed permit is scheduled for the Regional Water Board's **June 18/19, 2020** Board Meeting, or as announced in the Regional Water Board's agenda. The meeting will be held at the Regional Water Board office in Santa Rosa, California.

Please be aware that dates and venues may change. You can access the current agenda for changes in dates and locations at the [North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board website](#). At the public hearing, the Regional Water Board will consider whether to affirm, reject, or modify the proposed Rescission Order.

In order for the Regional Water Board to consider any evidentiary material concerning this hearing, any documents, including written technical reports and other evidentiary material, must be submitted to the Regional Water Board email at [NorthCoast@waterboards.ca.gov](mailto:NorthCoast@waterboards.ca.gov) no later than 5:00 p.m., on **March 27, 2020**. All documents that are received timely will be distributed to the Regional Water Board members and interested persons. These records will also become a permanent part of the administrative record for this public hearing.

Except at the discretion of the Regional Water Board Chair, written material received after the above date will not be accepted. If the Chair chooses to accept late written material, that material will not be incorporated into the administrative record if doing so would prejudice the Permittee or the Regional Water Board staff. The Chair may choose to modify this rule upon a showing of severe hardship (California Code of Regulations, Title 23, sections 648.1 and 648.4).

All those who plan to testify at this hearing must submit written statements to the Regional Water Board no later than **March 27, 2020**. The statements should provide the name of the witness, his or her qualifications (if an expert), and the scope of his or her intended testimony. The time limit for oral testimony or comments will be set by the Regional Water Board Chair and are subject to change. These time limits normally allow no more than 10 minutes each for Regional Water Board staff and Dischargers. All speakers are expected to honor these time limits. Other interested persons may also provide testimony at this public hearing. However, any testimony given by someone other than staff or the Dischargers, may be limited to 3 minutes and may only be given under the limited scope of summarizing or explaining any timely-submitted or late-accepted written evidence. No new evidence will be allowed to be presented at this public hearing. In an effort to be fair to all people who wish to testify at this public hearing, the Regional Water Board Chair may choose to use a timer to ensure that individuals stay within the time limits set by the Chair. The Chair also requests that in order to avoid unnecessary repetitive testimony, that one spokesperson be selected to speak on behalf of many individuals when those individuals share a common affiliation or interest.
