Waiver of Waste Discharge Requirements and General Water Quality Certification for Road Management and Activities Conducted Under the Five Counties Salmonid Conservation Program in the North Coast Region

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, North Coast Region (Regional Water Board), will conduct a public hearing to consider the adoption of the above-referenced Draft Order.

A public hearing to consider comments and objections to the Draft Order is scheduled for June 15 or 16, 2023, at 8:30 a.m. in the Regional Water Board Hearing Room, 5550 Skylane Blvd, Suite A, in Santa Rosa, California. This meeting is scheduled to occur with both a physical meeting location and an option for remote participation via video and teleconference. At the public hearing, the Regional Water Board will consider whether to affirm, reject, or modify the Draft Order.

Live video and audio broadcasts of the public hearing will be available via the internet and can be accessed at the <u>CalEPA Public meeting live webcasts webpage</u> (https://video.calepa.ca.gov). The public hearing will be recorded.

Please be aware that dates and venues may change. In accordance with the Bagley-Keene Open Meeting Act (Gov. Code, § 11120 et seq.), an agenda will be posted to the Board's website at least 10 days in advance of the meeting. The agenda will specify any updates to the meeting format. Overview

The existing Order, R1-2018-0011, (5C Waiver) which was adopted in 2018, applies to 14 different types of road management activities related to the routine and emergency repair and maintenance of rural and county roads and related facilities. The 5C Waiver groups

these activities into two categories, Category A and Category B, based on potential impacts to Waters of the State and establishes general and specific conditions, monitoring requirements, and eligibility criteria for each category. The 5C Waiver will expire on May 16, 2023. The Draft Order proposes to contain the same requirements as the 5C Waiver, with non-substantive revisions throughout, including updating findings specific to the renewal, correct typographical errors, and standardized formatting.

Oral comments or testimony will also be accepted at the hearing. The time limit for public oral comments or testimony will be 5 minutes; however, additional time may be provided, upon request, at the discretion of the Regional Water Board Chair. A timer may be used, and speakers are expected to honor time limits. Where speakers can be grouped by affiliation or interest, such groups will be expected to select a spokesperson to avoid unnecessary or repetitive presentations.
