Tam Doduc, State Board Liaison, reported that:

- The State Board adopted the Statewide Irrigation Permit using recycled water for landscape irrigation.
- State Board also adopted the Recycled Water Policy. State Board staff will be working with Regional Waters Boards staff on the implementation of the Recycled Water Policy.
- The Draft construction of the Stormwater Project will come before the State Board on September 2nd.

 A new proposed fee structure for water rights and water quality programs will be considered in September 2009.

On the topic of on-site wastewater systems (septic), Deputy Director for Water
Quality, Darin Polhemus is meeting with a group of Environmental Health Directors at
least monthly looking at proposing a risk-base approach to regulations, using three
tiers of requirements linked to impact water quality. It might be necessary to revisit
CEQA. A new draft of regulations is expected by late summer.
