Chairman Massey administered the oath to those who expected to testify.

John Short, Regional Water Board senior staff engineer, gave the opening statement for the Regional Water Board staff by providing a brief overview of the issues within the Santa Rosa Subregional Water Reclamation System NPDES Permit that was before the board for renewal. Mr. Short introduced Charles Reed as the Regional Water Board staff assigned to the Santa Rosa Sub-regional Water Reclamation System site, and who later gave a more detailed description of the NPDES Permit and the areas covered by the permit.

The City of Santa Rosa was represented by Richard Dowd, chairman of the Board for Public Utilities for the City of Santa Rosa. Mr. Dowd requested that the Board address three issues:

1) The monitoring program that requires new compliance requirements;

- 2) Sanitation sewer overflow regulations that are inconsistent with other regulations; and
- 3) Zero pound per year nutrient mass submission limit.

Mr. Dowd then introduced: Dr. Smith, City of Santa Rosa consultant; Miles Ferris, director of Santa Rosa Utilities; and Nicole Granquist, with the law firm of Downy Brand.

The meeting continued with the Regional Water Board staff and the City of Santa Rosa providing presentations to the Board and the opportunity for cross-examination.

### vii. Resolution No. R1-2006-0095 In Memoriam for Ronald Richard Allen

Chairman Massey read the Resolution in memoriam for Environmental Scientist Ronald R. Allen, who for the last five years, worked in the Cleanup Unit of the Regional Water Board-North Coast Region. The Board signed and adopted the Resolution unanimously.

 The Board continued the PUBLIC HEARING Order No. R1- 2006-0045, Santa Rosa Subregional Water Reclamation System, Renewal of National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit No. CA0022764, WDID No. 1B83099OSON

The Chairman called for the closing remarks from the Regional Water Board staff and the City of Santa Rosa and closing remarks were made.

After detailed discussions with the Regional Water Board staff and those representing the City of Santa Rosa Subregional Water Reclamation System, the Board went into closed session for deliberation.

Chairman Massey opened the board meeting to the public after their deliberation in closed session.

MOTION: John Corbett moved to adopt the permit as

recommended by staff with the understanding that the Board will have full amending authority. Heidi Harris seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

MOTION: John Corbett moved that Santa Rosa may submit an

alternative monitoring program for receiving water limits provided such a program is 1) acceptable to the Executive Officer; 2) that a preliminary site list is presented to the Regional Board Executive Officer within 180 days; 3) the alternative program can demonstrate compliance with the permit. The Executive Officer will inform Discharger whether the alternative monitoring program is acceptable, within 90 days. Santa Rosa shall have 90 additional days to implement the alternative existing monitoring if

approved by the Executive Officer.

Gerald Cochran seconded the motion. Motion passed

unanimously.

MOTION: John Corbett moved to amend the previous motion: In

the 180 days allowed for Santa Rosa to submit alternative monitoring program, Santa Rosa shall comply with the prior permit monitoring location requirements. Gerald Cochran seconded the motion.

Motion passed unanimously.

MOTION: John Corbett moved that the Late Revisions identified

on the handout by Regional Water Board staff be added to the Permit. This includes a reopener provision for the Discharger to complete a special study justifying alternative final numerical limitations for biostimulants. Gerald Cochran seconded the

motion. Motion passed unanimously.

John Corbett directed staff to develop a 303(d) TMDL work plan within sixty-days that includes deadlines for the Laguna de Santa Rosa meeting all state and federal requirements, including: a) deadlines be established for each program element, b) measurable progress steps be established, and c) demonstrated compliance with all federal and state 303(d) TMDL requirements. The 303(d) TMDL process must be completed within 4-years save approval of the Regional Board or justification of why it can't be met. The planning program

should specify deadlines for completion of the technical component of the TMDL so that the City may use these data in its study for alternative final numerical limitations for biostimulants.

# **Status Reports**

# 5. Region-Wide Sediment Amendment

Regional Water Board staff provided a status report to the Board on the proposed region-wide sediment amendment process. The PowerPoint presentation included summaries of: Regional characteristics necessitating regulation of sediment discharges, and Regional Water Board and State Water Board direction relative to sediment (non-point source) control.

- Limitations of the existing Basin Plan prohibition.
- Benefits to be obtained from a revised prohibition.
- General approach of prohibition.
- Proposed time frame for language development, outreach and Board deliberation.

Following Board discussion, staff was directed to meet individually with Board Members Bob Anderson and John Corbett to discuss amendment concept, approach and necessity.

# 6. Status Update on the Sediment TMDL Implementation Policy

Rebecca Fitzgerald presented an update on the TMDL Implementation Policy Statement for Sediment-Impaired Receiving Waters in the North Coast Region. The Policy is the Board's strategy to control sediment waste discharges and directs staff to undertake several tasks, including development of a workplan, a sediment control guidance document, a monitoring strategy, and the Desired Conditions Report. Ms. Fitzgerald briefly explained the history of the Policy, the implementation process of other sediment TMDLs, described each task, and gave an update on the status of each task. There were no public comments. Comments from Board Members focused primarily on the applicability of the Policy to all water bodies in the Region, distribution and use of the guidance document, how enforcement would work following compliance with the guidance document, and use of the Desired Conditions Report.

# **Action Item**

7. Study session on the **Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDLs) for Freshwater Creek and Elk River** with a section on legal mechanisms for permitting, compliance and enforcement TMDL Freshwater and Elk River Watersheds.

Adona White and Matt Buffleben gave an update to the Board on the status of the TMDLs in Elk River and Freshwater Creek. The TMDLs are slated for submission to the Board for approval in December 2007.

Mark Neely gave an update on the Watershed-wide WDRs for PALCO and Green Diamond in Elk and Freshwater. The enrollment of additional acreage under the "zero landslide discharge" plan is under consideration, with enrollments to occur soon.
