

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Watershed Stewardship Coordination Work Plan for FY 2018-2019

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1.0 BACKGROUND

The Watershed Stewardship Coordinator position was created during the 2014 reorganization to fulfill key elements of the newly adopted North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board's vision statement:

Healthy Watersheds; Effective Regulation; Strong Partnerships.

The Watershed Stewardship Program is building enhanced capabilities for the Regional Water Board to work with other agencies and organizations to develop comprehensive and collaborative water quality improvement measures that support desired environmental outcomes through an increased level of coordination. The Watershed Stewardship Program augments and compliments our regulatory programs. The initiative is based on defined watershed management areas and a cycle of steps intended to promote collaboration among participants. The initiative involves identifying stewardship leads within targeted watersheds and actively working with these leads to develop the watershed stewardship frameworks. The steps associated with the watershed stewardship approach management cycle are illustrated in the Watershed Stewardship Adaptive Management Cycle (See figure on front cover).

In addition to building and enhancing external partnerships, there are components of the program to build capability within our own organization. The Watershed Stewardship Program coordinates the efforts of the organization's other four specialists: Ecological Restoration, Flow, Groundwater, and Enforcement. Many of the watershed based solutions require coordinated participation across agency programs, and it is the Watershed Stewardship Coordinator who facilitates this cross-program coordination. The Watershed Stewardship Coordinator and Specialists contribute a more rigorous scientific approach to water quality assessment and the development and implementation of stewardship and regulatory programs.

The Work Plan below describes work within priority watersheds that is currently the focus of the Watershed Stewardship Program. The work plan describes a blend of activities addressing long-standing water quality impairments, special projects, and internal implementation of our vision statement.
