NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) staff will hold two California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) scoping meetings to seek input on the scope and content of the environmental information that should be considered in the development of a statewide bacterial objective for water contact recreation in fresh waters (also known as "REC-1") in the State of California.

The purpose of the scoping meetings is to provide a forum for early public consultation on the development of a statewide bacterial objective for REC-1 waters in the State of California. These consultations will assist the State Water Board in determining the scope and content of the environmental information that the Responsible and Trustee Agencies, as well as other interested parties, may require.

Scoping is helpful to the State Water Board in identifying the range of actions, alternatives, mitigations measures, and significant environmental effects to be analyzed prior to the decision-making process. Scoping has been found to be an effective way to bring together and resolve the concerns of affected federal, State, and local agencies, the proponent of the actions, and other interested persons including those who might not be in accord with the action on environmental grounds.

A quorum of State Water Board members may be present at the scoping meetings. No action will be taken by the State Water Board at the scoping meetings.
