In response to your order requiring all farmers in the State of California to be under one order concerning Nitrogen Reporting is non productive and only generates useless paperwork and reports concerning some regions of the state.

Foothill areas, such as El Dorado County, now designated as low vulnerability (**as a result of years of Scientific Data**) should be under a separate order.
