Dear Ms. Fregien,

The East San Joaquin Water Quality Coalition is submitting the June Quarterly Monitoring Data Report to the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board as required by the Conditional Waiver of Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges from Irrigated Lands Resolution Order No. R5-2006-0053, Monitoring and Reporting Program Order No. R5-2008-0005.

This June Quarterly Monitoring Data Report includes the following data for sampling that occurred between January 1 and March 31, 2012:

1. Hard copies (submitted as pdfs) of all laboratory reports including:
 - a. Quality Control Reports
 - b. Laboratory Analytical Reports
 - c. Toxicity Reports with raw data including copies of the original bench sheets
2. Hard copies (submitted as pdfs) of all field sheets
3. Electronic submittal in SWAMP comparable format of all available data (SWAMP comparable Access database)

All laboratory reports include a lab narrative describing QC failures, analytical problems and anomalous occurrences, chain of custody forms including sample receipt documentation, sample results for contract and subcontract laboratories with reporting limits (RLs or PQLs) and results for all QC samples.

Results for field, chemistry and toxicity data including field and laboratory QC have been entered into a SWAMP comparable Access database which is being supplied to the Regional Board on a CD to be delivered on June 1, 2012 with a copy of the reports (submitted as pdfs on a separate CD). Any data not included in the database have been noted in the word document titled "ESJ_060112_DataCD_Notes" included on the CD. This letter will be mailed with an original signature to the Regional Board and the CDs will be hand delivered to the Regional Board on June 1, 2012.
